Bird Blood Worm
Part 107, May 9, 2019

Welcome to where we're learning to do what we know to be true!

You can't set someone free who doesn't want to be. So, do you want to be set free? From the ways of this world, the plague of your heart, and the filth of your sin?



Leprosy is God's chief comparable for sin. And, Jesus and His boys went on a whirlwind tour to teach and to touch and to heal every untouchable, incurable, leprous disease throughout the land.



And, Matthew tells us that in this way Jesus literally "took up our infirmities and carried our diseases." (Mt 8:16-17)

The poor wore white because dyeing wasn't cheap.



And cleaning wasn't easy, so they always looked grubby. But, Jesus deeply embraced their contagious grubs.



Now we return to when Jesus returned, to Jerusalem, to reunite with His boys one year before the cross.



The public offering for each healed leper, as commanded by Moses, as a testimony of Jesus, (Mk 1:44) included two songbirds: one was killed so the other could be covered in its blood and set free. (Lev 14:1-7)



On that Passover, the skies were filled with the signs of the One who was to come on the following Passover; and, the city was abuzz about those birds. Because, as the rain washed away the blood, each and every bird likely, mysteriously, stayed ... red! Because of Moses' command, and Jesus' testimony, and a teeny-tiny, incredibly significant ... worm; and, a crucial component of each leper's offering.



[Just minutes before His death] Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?" which is translated, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" – Mark 15:34 NKJ



Which directs the attention of those with ears to hear to Psalm 22, a portrait of this precise moment, painted 1,000 years before.

My God, My God, why have You forsaken *Me?* Why are You so far from helping *Me* ... [Our *fathers*] trusted, and You delivered *them*. *They* cried to You, and were delivered; *they* trusted in You, and were not ashamed. *But I am* a *worm*, and no *man*; – Psalm 22:1, 4-6 NKJ



A very specific orange-red grub-like worm called towla'.

They're mothers were crushed to make "Towla' Shaniy" or scarlet dye, for the garments of the High Priest (Ex 28:2-6), the door of the Tabernacle (Ex 26:36), and the veil of the Holy of Holies (Ex 26:31-33).

But [as Isaiah prophesied about Christ] he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. — Isaiah 53:5 NIV

Jesus is *our High Priest* (Heb 2:17), *and the Door* (Jn 10:9); and, the veil tore to open "a new and living way" through "His flesh". (Heb 10:19-20)

He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. *If that's* what you want.

The Truth will set you free only if you seek and find and follow.

So, do you want to be set free to fully follow Him as Lord? Then, just determine to do what you know to be true. And, your limited knowledge will quickly become tried and true wisdom.

[Moses] took the blood ... with water, scarlet [towla'] wool and branches of hyssop, and sprinkled the scroll and all the people ... [and] the tabernacle and everything used in its ceremonies. – Hebrews 9:19-21 NIV

[Isaiah prophesied] His appearance was so disfigured beyond that of any man ["I am a tola" and no man"] ... so will he sprinkle many nations ... For what they were not told, [in Psalm 22] they will see, [without perceiving the purpose] and what they have not heard, [in Psalm 22] they will understand. [Yet, only as facts, devoid of power] — Isaiah 52:14-15 NIV

Incline your ears ... [and] I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings of old ... For [the Lord] established a <u>testimony in Jacob</u>, and appointed a <u>law in Israel</u> ... – Psalm 78:1b-2, 5 NKJ

"Fear not, thou worm towla" Jacob and ye men of Israel; I will help thee," saith the Lord and thy Redeemer, – Isaiah 41:14a NKJ

How then can man be righteous before God? ... [If] the <u>stars are not pure</u> in His sight, how much less <u>man</u>, who is a <u>maggot</u>, <u>[rimmah]</u> and a <u>son of man</u>, who is a <u>worm</u>?" [towla'] – Job 25:4-6 NKJ

A <u>Star</u> shall come out of <u>Jacob</u> [thou towlar]; a Scepter shall <u>rise</u> out of <u>Israel</u>, – Num 24:17 NKJ

My God, My God, why have You forsaken *Me*? Why are You so far from helping *Me* ... [Our *fathers*] trusted, and You delivered *them*. *They* cried to You, and were delivered; *They* trusted in You, and were not ashamed. *But I am* a *worm*, [Towla'] and no *man*; ["who is a maggot," that is: a child of Towla' – the Son of Man – and that's why! And therefore] ...

I am poured out like water ... My heart is like wax; it has melted within Me. My strength is dried up like a potsherd, and ... You have brought Me to the dust of death. ... You have answered Me. ... You who fear the Lord, praise Him! All you descendants of Jacob, glorify Him, and fear Him, all you offspring of Israel! For He has not despised nor abhorred the affliction of the afflicted; nor has He hidden His face from Him; but when He cried to Him, He heard. — Psalm 22:6, 14-15, 21, 23-24 NKJ



And, when Jesus cries out the title of Psalm 22 from the cross, He equates himself in that moment, with the scarlet towla'.



curls into a *cup* that protects her newborns, as she pours out her life so they can feed on her body.

The towla' mama attaches herself to a tree or a post, and slowly





And over a three-day period, she's covered in fuzzy white wax, that looks like snow, and a puffy ball of wool.



"Let us reason together," says the Lord, "Though your sins are like scarlet [shaniy], they shall be as white as snow; [a term used for the leprous (Ex 4:6); and according to the leprosy laws: "if the leprosy has covered all his body, the priest shall pronounce him clean ... (if) It has all turned white" (Lev 13:12-13)] though they are red like crimson [towla'], they shall be as wool [because of the blood of the Lamb that became the worm]." — Isaiah 1:18 NKJ



God made him who had no sin [shaniy] to be sin [Towla'] for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. – 2 Cor 5:21 NIV

Towla' mamas were even ground as medicine to regulate the heart.

But, the towla' becomes a curse of the vine to the half-hearted.

[The day before he died, Moses warned] If you do not obey the voice of the Lord your God, to observe carefully all His commandment ... You shall plant vineyards and tend them, but you shall neither drink of the wine nor gather the grapes; for the worms [towla'] shall eat them. – Deuteronomy 28:15, 39 NKJ

Whereas, our Vine poured out His wine when He became our curse.

Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us (for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree") [like the towla'!] – Galatians 3:13 NKJ

Remember how Jesus said it'd be better to enter life maimed or one-eyed, than with two hands, feet, or eyes, to be cast into hell ...

... where 'Their worm does not die and the fire is not quenched.' [They doom themselves to ongoing anguish] — Mark 9:46 NKJ

He's quoting Isaiah 66:24 about the "<u>towla'</u>" of the "<u>rebellious</u>". You see, **if our towla' doesn't die**, **it torments us**. Instead of providing life through its death; it consumes and torments.

[Remember bitter Jonah?] And the Lord God prepared a plant and made it come up over Jonah, that it might be shade for his head to deliver him from his misery. So Jonah was very grateful for the plant. But as morning dawned the next day [Jonah still wished hatefueled destruction on his repentant enemies; so] God prepared a worm, [a towla'] and it so damaged the plant that it withered. And it happened, when the sun arose ... the sun beat on Jonah's head, so that he grew faint. Then he wished death for himself, and said, "It is better for me to die than to live." [So true] – Jonah 4:6-8 NKJ

Whoever hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him. By this we know love, because He laid down His life for us. And we also ought to lay down our lives for the brethren. – 1 John 3:15-16 NKJ

I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the *mercies* of God, that you present *your bodies* a *living sacrifice* ... [and] be transformed by the renewing of your mind, – Romans 12:1-2a NKJ

On the Mount of Transfiguration:

[Jesus] clothes became *shining*, *exceedingly white*, like *snow*, as white as the *light* such as *no launderer* on *earth* can *whiten* them. – Mt 17:2; Mk 9:3 NKJ

They weren't just *extra-white.* Jesus' boys were used to seeing Him grubby. The *miracle* was *cleaning* that *thing!* **Not a cleaning, but a** *renewing.* A dying to self.

He said to them all, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me. – Luke 9:23 NKJ

He died and dyed, that we might live.

He died for all, that those who live should live no longer for themselves, but for Him who died for them and rose again. – 2 Corinthians 5:15 NKJ

If our worm doesn't die, we can't live. But, when *our* towla' died, both blood and water came from His side, to cover our sin, and extinguish the flames!

If that's what you want.

'Cause, you can't set someone free who doesn't want to be.

But, if you do, then just do what you know to be true.
