## YAH Who?

## The Name Above Every Name April 17, 2022

## It's Easter morning! And He is risen! He is risen indeed!



Who is? **Jesus**? *That's* the English conversion of the Greek transliteration of the **Hebrew word for Salvation**. **Yeshua**.

The angel of the Lord said:



You shall call His name <u>Yeshua</u>, [same as the OT name Joshua (Zec 6:11-12)] for He will <u>save</u> His people from their <u>sins</u>. – Matthew 1:21 NKJ



He has a *lot* of names like *that*. Messiah. Lord. Emanuel. Prince of Peace. The Christ. The Branch. The Lamb. But what's His *real* name? The name above all His other names? (Phil 2:9) For *that*, we need to go on an Easter *treasure* hunt; because it's a *mystery* – it's Salvation's *unknown* name.



By the way, one of the *weirdest, saddest, critiques* I've received by some who've left His Place, is that there's just *too much Bible*. Well, all I can say is, I'm glad they're not here *today!* So strap in! *Because* ...



[John wrote, in *Revelation*] I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse. And He who sat on him was called <u>Faithful and True</u> ... [but] He had a name <u>written</u> that <u>no one knew</u> ... [First clue: the One called Faithful and True had a name written that no one knew] and [second clue] His name is called <u>The Word of God</u>. – Revelation 19:11-13 NKJ



Case solved? Not yet. It's not written that that's His name. Although it is a little-known title by which He's called, quite often. For instance:

The Word of God came to Shemaiah [the prophet] – 1 Kings 12:22 NKJ

[And] The Word of God came to Nathan [the prophet] – 1 Chronicles 17:3-4 NKJ

[And] The Word came to Jeremiah [the prophet] — Jeremiah 21:1 NIV

[And] Of this salvation [Yeshua] the prophets ... searched carefully, who prophesied of the grace that would come to you, searching what ... the Spirit of Christ who was in [the prophets] was indicating when He testified beforehand – 1 Peter 1:10-11 NKJ

**So the** *Spirit* **of Christ,** who testified about *himself* before He came in the flesh, **is called the Word of God** – which explains John's *full title* for the "<u>Faithful and True</u> ... <u>Word of God</u>" as ...

The Faithful and True Witness, the Beginning of the creation of God – Revelation 3:14 NKJ



Oh-ho! Do you see our *third* clue? The "Faithful and True" Word of God was the "Beginning of the creation of God". Any idea where to for our next clue? We sing: You were the Word at the beginning. But who wrote it? John! Same guy who wrote the Revelation mystery, opens His Gospel with a trail of clues! Chapter one, verse one:



In the *beginning* was the *Word,* and the Word was *with God,* and the Word was *God.* – John 1:1 NKJ



One of my Spiritual pet peeves is *over-spiritualizing* Scripture that's intended for more *childlike* minds. We read *this* and go: Hmm, so Jesus is the *eternal*, *preexistent Logos*. Sure. Yes. True. But don't *miss* the most *obvious*, kids! What did God say at the *beginning*? Here's a hint:

The entrance of Your words gives <u>light</u> – Psalm 119:130 NKJ

That's the Word at the beginning! Jesus is that. So is God. Did you know there's a big controversy surrounding "the Word of God" at "the beginning of creation"? Because on day one, "God said, 'Let there be light,' and there was light". (Gen 1:1-4) No problem. But it's not till day four that "He makes the sun". (Gen 1:14-19) So what's the One on day one? John's clues shed some light.

In the beginning ["of creation"] was the Word, ["of God", and "God said, 'Let there be light'; and Jesus said "I am the light of the world" (Gen 1:3; Jn 8:12)] and the Word was with God, ["God wraps himself in light" (Ps 104:2)] and the Word was God. ["God is light" (1 Jn 1:5)] He was in the beginning with God. ["The sun (from day 4) will no more be your light (it'll burn out; but) ... the LORD will be your everlasting light ... your Sun (from day 1) will never set again" (Is 60:19-20)] All things were made through Him ["He is before all things," and "in Him we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:28; Col 1:17-18)] ... In Him was life, ["I am the resurrection and the life" (Jn 11:25)] and the life was the light of men. ["He who follows Me shall ... have the light of life." (Jn 8:12)] ... That was the True Light [as in "Faithful and True" (Rev 3:14)] ... [And] as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name [so "live as children of Light" (Eph 5:8)] ... And the Word ["in the beginning" (Jn 1:1)] became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, ["His face shone like the sun" (Mt 17:2)] ... Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! ["The Lamb is its light" (Rev 21:23)] – John 1 NKJ

So is Light, the unknown written name of Yeshua? No. But it lights the path to find it ... in Isaiah.


[Isaiah wrote 750 years before Jesus, that our *everlasting Sun*] [Zion's] righteousness shines out like the dawn, her Salvation [Yeshua] like a blazing torch. – Isaiah 62:1 NIV

As a light to the Gentiles, that You should be My Salvation [Yeshua] – Isaiah 49:6 NKJ

And that's just a small sampling; but I'll read what he wrote about this Yeshua who's everlasting light rises like a sun that never sets; and let's see if you notice His *written* name, that's mostly unknown to this day. I'm just reading from the New King James; I haven't changed any words.

Behold, God *is* my Salvation [Yeshua], I will trust and not be afraid; for YAH, the LORD, is my strength and song; He also has become my Salvation [Yeshua]. ... 4 call upon His name ... make mention that His name is exalted. ... 25:1 I will praise Your name, for ... 8 He will swallow up death forever ... 9 Behold, this is our God; we have waited for Him, and He will save us [Hey, that's why they named Him Jesus!] ... we will be glad and rejoice in His Salvation [Yeshua]. 10 For on this mountain the hand of the LORD will rest ... 11 He will spread out His hands in their midst as a swimmer reaches out to swim ... 26:4 Trust in the LORD forever, for in YAH, the LORD, is everlasting strength. ... 8 The desire of our soul is for Your name – Isaiah 12:2-4, 25:1-11; 26:4-8 NKJ







<sup>4</sup> Sing to God, sing *praises* to His *name*; extol Him who *rides* on the *clouds*, by His *name YAH* ... <sup>20</sup> Our God is the God of *salvation*; and to GOD the Lord belong escapes from death. ... <sup>34</sup> His *strength* is in the *clouds*. – Psalm 68:4-34 NKJ



YAH rides on the *clouds?* Where's *David* getting this? Well, **Psalm 68** is about Moses' song of YAH Yeshua's triumph at the Red Sea.

Moses and the children of Israel sang this song ... "[The LORD] has triumphed gloriously! ... YAH is my strength and song, and He has become my Yeshua" — Exodus 15:1-2 NKJ

In Revelation, at the *ultimate* triumph of the *LORD*, **they sing "the song of Moses and the Lamb"**. (15:3) Turns out **the One who's name is** *Salvation* **is the** *Lamb* — and *this* **is the song of** *Moses!* But what's Moses doing with YAH Yeshua, who rides on the clouds? Skeptics would say, "He doesn't *literally ride* on the *clouds*." Whereas, a *child* would say, "Cool!" And guess who gets it *right!* 



When Moses entered the *tabernacle*, [i.e. *tent* "of meeting" (Ex 33:7)] the pillar of *cloud* descended [And Jesus said, "No one has *ascended* ... except the One who *descended*" (Jn 3:13)] and stood *at* the door [And Jesus said, "I stand at the door" (Rev 3:20)] ... So the LORD spoke to Moses <u>face to face</u>, as a man speaks to his friend. — Exodus 33:8-11 NKJ

But I thought the LORD specifically told Moses, just nine verses before that, that ...

"You cannot see My face, for no man can see Me and live!" – Exodus 33:20 NAS

Well, He did. So who's riding in on a cloud for a face-to-face? Well, "His name [is] YAH". You see, Yhwh is the big invisible God you can't look at and live – but YAH is the "face-to-face version".

[Moses said] "Show me now Your way, that I may know You" ... And [the LORD] said, "My Presence [lit. Face] will go with you." — Exodus 33:12-14 NKJ

And the [face of the] LORD went ... in a pillar of cloud to lead the way, – Exodus 13:21 NKJ

[And] [Jesus said] "I am the way ... He who has seen Me has seen the Father" – John 14:6-9 NKJ

[For God] has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the *face* of *Jesus Christ.* – 2 Corinthians 4:6 ESV

[Whenever the cloud was taken up] Moses said, "Rise up, O LORD!" ... – Numbers 10:35-36 NIV

[And when Jesus had risen] He was taken up, and a cloud received Him – Acts 1:9 NKJ

Because Jesus Christ is the glory of God made manifest! And He is risen! He is risen indeed!

"I have blotted out, like a *thick cloud*, your *transgressions*, and like a *cloud*, your *sins*. ... for I have redeemed you" ... says the LORD, your Redeemer – Isaiah 44:22, 24 NKJ

<sup>8</sup> Who *is* mighty like You, O YAH? ... <sup>9</sup> You rule the raging of the sea; when its waves rise, You still them. [Sound *familiar*?] ... <sup>15</sup> Blessed are the people who ... [walk] in the *light* of Your *countenance*. [lit. *face*] <sup>16</sup> In Your name they *rejoice* – Psalm 89:8-9, 15-16 NKJ



Moses' Messenger-of-God's-face is none other the Spirit of Christ *before* He *emptied* himself to *make* himself like *us*.

Christ Jesus ... being in very nature *God* ... *made* himself ... in human likeness. And ... *humbled* himself ... on a *cross!* Therefore God *exalted* Him ... and *gave* Him the *name* that is *above every name*, – Philippians 2:5-9 NIV

I'm glad the NKJ preserved the name YAH where they did; but sadly, it's paraphrased as LORD in the very passages where David exhorts us to use it to praise Him by name. And by us, I mean us!

This will be written for the *generation* to *come*, that a people *yet* to be *created* may praise YAH. [I put it back] For He looked down from the height of His sanctuary ... to release those appointed to death, to declare the *name* of YHWH – Psalm 102:18-21 NKJ

Praise YAH! ... He sent redemption ... Holy and awesome is His name! - Psalm 111:1, 9 ESV

Praise YAH! ... Save us [that's why we call Him Jesus] ... that we may give thanks to Your holy name ... Praise YAH! — Psalm 106:1, 47-48 ESV

So ... think we should be praising Jesus by that name?! YAH? Well, good news and happy Easter! You already do – it's just time that you knew that you do; because the Hebrew word for praise is hallelu! So let's re-read that last verse together, using the one Hebrew word we still do.

Hallelu YAH! ... Save us ... that we may give thanks to Your holy name ... Hallelu YAH! — Psalm 106:1, 47-48 ESV

I will lift up the cup of **Salvation** [Yeshua] and call on the name of the LORD [Yhwh] ... I will offer to You the sacrifice of thanksgiving ... Hallelu YAH! — Psalm 116:3-19 ESV

Hallelu YAH! ... Light dawns in the darkness – Psalm 112:1, 4 ESV

Hallelu YAH! ... Hallelu Him, sun and moon ... for He [who appeared on day one] commanded and they were created. [On day four] ... Hallelu the name of the LORD, for His name alone is exalted [above every name; so] ... Hallelu YAH! — Psalm 148:1-14 ESV

And David's command to Hallelu YAH is only fulfilled one time, in one place in the Bible, to one Savior, wherein "hallelu YAH" is sung as an expression rather than an exhortation. Guess where. In ...

The revelation of Jesus Christ ... Look, He is coming with the clouds, – Revelation 1:7 NIV

<sup>1</sup> I [John, writer of the mystery name and the Gospel trail] heard a loud voice of a great multitude in heaven, [praising Christ's *ultimate* triumph] saying, "hallelu YAH! Salvation and glory and honor and power belong to the Lord our God! ... <sup>3</sup> Again they said, "hallelu YAH!" ... <sup>4</sup> and worshiped God who sat on the throne, saying, "Amen! Hallelu YAH!" ... <sup>7</sup> for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and His wife [the church (Eph 5:31-32)] has made herself ready ... <sup>10</sup> Worship God! For the testimony of Jesus is the Spirit of prophecy." [Because "the Spirit of Christ ... testified beforehand" (1 Pet 1:11)] <sup>11</sup> Now I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse. [But that's a whole different Easter] And He who sat on him was called Faithful and True [Witness (Rev 3:14)] ... He had a name written that no one knew except Himself. [Sad, but true] – Revelation 19:1-12 NKJ

**Hallelujah is a** *two-word* **phrase.** And we *need* to sing it that *way* – **as praise to the** *name* **of the** *One* **who** *came before* **the** *sun,* and then *came* in the *flesh,* and *died* on the *cross,* and *rose* from the *grave,* and *knows* you by *name!* So I think it's *time* we got *familiar* with *His!* And ...



Since we are surrounded by so *great* a *cloud* of *witnesses*, – Hebrews 12:1 NKJ

Let everything that has breath Hallelu YAH. — Psalm 150:6 NKJ

Our risen Sun that'll never set!

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.

## Extra Hallelus

Praise the LORD, O my soul. ... <u>He wraps himself in light as with a garment</u> ... <u>He makes the clouds His chariot and rides on the wings of the wind</u>. ... Bless the LORD, O my soul! *Praise* YAH! – Psalm 104:1-3, 35 ESV

Oh give thanks to the LORD; call upon His name ... Praise YAH! - Psalm 105:1, 45 ESV

Hallelu YAH! ... Hallelu the *name* of the LORD! *Blessed* be the *name* of the LORD from this time forth and forevermore! From the rising of the sun to its setting, [He is risen! He'll never set! (Is 60:20)] the *name* of the LORD is to be hallelu'd! ... Hallelu YAH! — Psalm 113:1-4, 9 ESV

Hallelu YAH! I will give thanks to the LORD ... in the *congregation*. ... He sent *redemption* ... Holy and *awesome* is His name! ... His *praise* endures forever! — Psalm 111:1, 9-10 ESV O LORD, not to *us*, but to *Your name* give glory ... The *dead* do not Hallelu YAH ... but *we* will bless YAH from this time forth and forevermore. Hallelu YAH! — Psalm 115:1, 11, 17-18 ESV

**Hallelu** the LORD, all nations! Extol Him, all peoples! For great is His steadfast love toward us, and the faithfulness of the LORD endures forever. **Hallelu YAH!** – Psalm 117 ESV

Hallelu YAH! Hallelu the *name* of the LORD, give hallelu, O servants of the LORD ... Hallelu YAH, for the LORD is good; sing to His *name*, – Psalm 135:1, 3 ESV

Hallelu YAH! Hallelu the LORD, O my soul! ... Hallelu YAH! - Psalm 146:1, 10 ESV

Hallelu YAH! For it is good to sing praises to our God ... and a song of praise is fitting. – Psalm 147:1 ESV

**Hallelu YAH!** Sing to the LORD a *new song* ... Let them **hallelu** His *name* ... He adorns the humble with **Salvation**. ... Let the *high praises* of God be in their *throats* and *two-edged swords* in their hands ... *This* is honor for all His godly ones. **Hallelu YAH!** – Psalm 149:1-9 ESV

Hallelu YAH! Hallelu God in His sanctuary; hallelu Him in His mighty heavens! Hallelu Him for His mighty deeds; Hallelu Him according to His excellent greatness! Hallelu Him with trumpet sound; Hallelu Him with lute and harp! Hallelu Him with tambourine and dance; Hallelu Him with strings and pipe! Hallelu Him with sounding cymbals; Hallelu Him with loud clashing cymbals! Let everything that has breath Hallelu YAH! Hallelu YAH! — Psalm 150 ESV

I [Daniel] was watching in the night visions, and behold, <u>One like the Son of Man</u>, <u>coming with the clouds of heaven!</u> ... To Him was given ... everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, – Daniel 7:13-14
