## Open Book

Testing Ourselves with God's Word
June 26, 2022

Today we're testing how true our love for the Lord is. And to get an honest answer, we gotta open with this: How reasonable is your relationship with God? That is, if you were to present the case you've been building to back up your belief in Him, would others buy it? Are there good reasons for the way you see things, or do you hope more than know?

We need to be aware, because how we believe what we believe determines our credibility and our belief's integrity. And I'm not trying to be challenging here but, c'mon, better reasons make you a more reasonable person, literally. And that's important because being reasonable makes you trustworthy — which in turn, makes you a more compelling witness. I know, because in my B.C. days, it was those reasonable people that kept me on the hook and ultimately reeled me in.







So last week, when Bruce preached a whole sermon about Jesus's dad, Joseph, despite the extremely limited Scripture about him—I loved the look we took at the biblical reasoning we can use to paint a better picture. Because it's a critical reminder that deeper digging does get you to the gold, but also, reading between the lines does not mean reading into them. Besides, it's actually fun uncovering Scripture's hidden stories forensically; building solid deductions from the information. Not flimsy conjectures from our imaginations.

And I, like a lot of you, am at this particular and peculiar church largely because of that approach right there. And that does not mean condemnation of other congregations at all — only that those of us with a compulsive questioning disorder need a place to work out our faith according to our condition. And here at His Place, we use 'Bible forensics', to grow our faith by building our case on:

[Faith is] the *substance* of things hoped for, [by *collecting*] the *evidence* of things *not* seen. – Hebrews 11:1 NKJ

And here's why: if our Creator really wants a loving relationship with any of us, He has to have made Himself knowable. And a deeper relationship with anyone always means listening, learning, and adjusting our perspective to see their true self. So trust that God is an open book to anyone with an open mind. And as a loving God, He must be doing everything possible on His end to get us closer. Which means God has open arms to anyone with an open heart. So, it's only when we consciously or sub-consciously shut Him out somewhere – that our relationship stalls. And that means the missing pieces in our understanding all come from us closing off communication.

For whatever is hidden is *meant* to be disclosed, and whatever is concealed is *meant* to be brought out into the open. – Mark 4:22 NIV

[After all] It is the glory of God to conceal a matter; to search out a matter is the glory of kings. – Proverbs 25:2 NIV

He's literally dying to share the total truth that makes sense of the universe, we just have to work to keep ourselves and His book, open. Emphasis on the word work. Not that we work for our salvation! Just saying, if you pray for God to move a mountain, plan on waking up next to a shovel.


[Y'know:] Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of truth. – 2 Timothy 2:15-17 NKJ

Now *somewhere* along the way, people got the idea that Christianity is somehow a *crutch* or *convenience* and that we *believe* because we're *naïve*, *uniformed*, and it's *easy*... and to be fair, I leaned that way before I switched teams, but now — WHAT?! Has that been *your* experience?! Easy sounds dreamy — but *nothing* in my life has called *more* into question, taken up *more* mental real estate, or *inconvenienced* me *more* than my walk with God. Because **our understanding of this place hinges on the amount of our life that we devote to knowing Him**. Which is why we're repeatedly told that the full relationship comes when we:

Love the Lord your God with *all* your heart and with *all* your soul and with *all* your *mind* and with *all* your strength.' – Mark 12:30 NIV

If you want it all, you gotta give your all! And God wrote His Word in such a way that it tests the amount of heart, soul, strength, and mind you're willing to give. Sure, He could've written it in a way that left no room for discussion, debate, or doubt – but He didn't... on purpose! Cuz you know what those difficulties do? They give you a look in the spiritual mirror! Because your understanding provides you with a measure of the mental muscle you're willing to give. On a scale of none to all. And God's goal is to push us all in! So –

So let's talk *Bible forensics*. And don't you *dare* zone out and pretend it's too *brainy* for you – *this* is where you love the Lord with all your mind! So stay with me! Bible forensics is just the term we're using for **digging past the surface of Scripture by using our God-given reasoning to reconstruct the details and stories not explicitly stated. And it's** *important***, because the Bible becomes a real problem for a lot of people when they realize the stories are all chopped up and scattered. Yet it's** *because* **of this design that it's also an** *opportunity* **spiritually stretch our mental muscles and express our obedient, trusting, desire to better** *know* **the God we** *claim* **to** *love***. And there's** *tons* **of great books on this approach, but when hunting that one, big,** *unifying* **truth behind all those scattered clues in God's Word, give me J. Warner Wallace, the exhomicide** *detective***. Cuz his book** *Cold-Case Christianity* **has some great tips for** *Godly gumshoes***. So let's put our detective hats** *on* **and put our faith to the test by** *examining* **how we** *handle* **God's Word.** *First* **–** 

**Do you WASH YOUR HANDS**? Search yourself and *ditch* your background beliefs, baggage, and assumptions. Regardless of your *awareness*, they're *there* and they taint every word ever heard.

So we *must* seek and destroy every *expectation* and *agenda* if we want to be open *minded* when we open His *book*. How often do *you* pray like *this*:

Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting. – Psalms 139:23-24 NIV

Ouch! That first step is a *doozie!* Calling out our personal *bias* is a *powerful* but *painful* prayer – because we are riddled with them! And **they make** it *impossible* to **discern** *God's* **voice** from *our* **agenda.** So we gotta scrub 'em off or we could compromise the Bible bits we collect! *Remember*–

Who may ascend the mountain of the Lord? Who may stand in His holy place? The one who has *clean hands* and a *pure heart*, who does *not* trust in an idol or swear by a *false* god [like the picture we paint of *our* God *before* opening *His* book]. – Psalms 24:3-4 NIV

But after a good cleaning, it's time to **COLLECT THE EVIDENCE**. As you read the Bible, remember to keep your eyes, ears, heart, and mind open to everything or you risk missing something. If you only look for something specific – you can overlook something substantial. Hold your horses and don't bring back your bias by favoring just your favorite parts! Lay them all on the table, whether or not they seem helpful because:

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness [even though we won't know when each piece's purpose will present] 2 Timothy 3:16 NIV





Like Pokemon – to be prepared for any battle – you gotta catch 'em all! And once you do, you can start to **DEVELOP DEDUCTIONS**. Put your pieces together into possible pictures. And honestly, they really do this on their own. Cuz every person, place, story, and symbol of Scripture makes it clear where they fit – if you're clear on the difference between deduction and conjecture.

To trust our beliefs, they must be built on factual *conclusions* not pleasant *possibilities*. From the foundation up, **the case for our faith must arrange all our evidence in** *reasonable* **order**. And until then, we can't *deduce* their meaning or what's missing.

For instance – understanding the four Gospels as *conflicting* accounts of a true story means our reasoning can only build on *inconclusive* evidence which is, by definition, *speculation*. Whereas reasoning built on *irrefutable* evidence (like a flawless *harmony* of all four Gospels) produces factual *deductions*. Because **deductions** are just the logical results of whatever premise we present. There's no wiggle room in logic; it's mathematic and only bears the fruit of its foundation. This is how I always reasoned with my kids; most recently, "We want a dog!" "Okay, let's say that happens, what's the logical conclusion?" And we landed on "probably, a dead dog". But I was proud they didn't do much of what we *all do* to get the conclusion we *want*: switch to a *false* premise. They didn't say, "Forget the dead Guinea pigs, *this time* we'll be responsible." Even though building on *that false* premise, might logically lead to a living dog.

So when we build our faith on a *Scriptural* foundation, we need to be careful not to falsify what it says to produce the outcome we want. Any modification in the foundation produces profound problems as you build, and will turn your deductions into a full-fledged fallacy. Think Galatians:

You are turning away so *soon* ... to a *different* Gospel, which is *not* another; but there are some who trouble you and want to *pervert* the Gospel of Christ. – Galatians 1:6-7 NKJ

So lastly, check for foreign influence. **TAKE THE TRUTH TEST and make sure your heart hasn't been compromised.** Grab a Bible and *examine your motives*. Any conviction when you read:



He who *trusts* in his *own* heart is a fool.

A fool has no delight in understanding, but in expressing his *own* heart.

The way of a fool is right in *his own* eyes. – Proverbs 28:26; 18:2; 12:15

God's Word *cleanses, clarifies* or *convicts* its readers because it just takes *our premise* to its *logical conclusion* to *show us* what we're willing to work for.

To humans belong the plans [thoughts] of the heart, but from the Lord comes the proper answer of the tongue. All a person's ways seem pure to them, but motives are weighed by the Lord. Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and He will establish your plans [thoughts]. The Lord works out everything to its proper end [logical conclusion]. — Proverbs 16:1-4 NIV

That's it. All the evidence in *this* world and in *His* Word was *designed* for you to find the reasons *behind* the *one* decision that determines *everything*: **What foundation are you building on?** It's all about who our heart appoints as the ultimate *authority*. And if we want a *real*, *reasonable* relationship with God, we can only build on the premise *He* authorized, *His Word*. I mean –

The Word was with God, and the Word was God. – John 1:1 NKJ

But the Bible is a poignant example of God's *perfection* and *plan*, and it's been brilliantly designed to teach us *about His character and our own*, by just allowing us to *choose* how we handle it.

Those who want to reject God, can. Those who want to revise God, can. Those who want to receive God, can. And again, I've *personally* used it for all three – and I can tell you only *one* approach has truly felt *reasonable* and had a logical conclusion that was *worth* working for.

Because as you read to *receive*, you'll discover Jesus *Himself* came to show us what unbiased, clean hands can do when they open His Word with an open mind and get to work. It's *us* who've been tainting that premise ever since. And I'm a little sick of people thinking that *they* decide what kind of God they get – it's the *Real* one or *None!* And we need to stop bending His book to fit our wants and start bending ourselves to fit His Word! And that means *pushing* yourself to the limit as you seek Him. And *struggling* to let go of your expectations and assumptions. Cuz you and I, we're not interested in easy. Like any detective worth their salt, we demand untainted, trustworthy, and total truth. Cuz like I said, if you want God to move a mountain, you better be prepared to wake up next to a shovel. Well – if you really want a *reasonable* relationship with the Lord, you better be prepared to wake up next to His Word... and *read* it.
