Ship Shape Setting Ourselves for Smooth Sailing November 6, 2022

Today we're talking about sailing into sanctification. But first ...











Ever heard of *cluster flies?* Often called *attic flies;* cuz they *hide* in *attics.* And they *hibernate* in a *huge cluster.* I *know* this, because, a couple years ago, I was in our *little attic,* where I keep our *family mementos.* And I saw a couple *flies* walk up the *wall* and go into a *vent grill.* So I *banged* on it with my *fist* to get 'em to come *out.* And *out* they *came! Thousands.* The *entire attic* was a *fog* of *flies.* So I put on a *sweatshirt* and a *hat,* and took up a *shop vac filled* with *fly spray,* and *sucked* 'em out of the *air,* and *everywhere* they *tried* to *hide,* till I'd *abolished* every *last one.* I was the *lord* of those *flies,* and I wasn't *pleased!*

Last Sunday, Noah said, every moment you let the *old* you *live*, you're *aiding* an *enemy* who's using you to gather *strength* to take you out. Which means *sin* is a *hired killer* that we pay, for our own assassination. And I loved His point that Jesus is *living in* part of our heart, as He's moving into the whole. And so, to make more room for *Him*, you gotta *exterminate* the swarm of the old you crew. Now, hiding a Jew during the *holocaust* was *right* and *good* and *heroic;* but try to imagine being a Jew and hiding a Nazi bent on killing you. That'd be *insane*. And yet, that's us when we allow sin to hide within. We're *nuts!* Nutzis! For a couple years now, when I pray for God's power to do the very thing I want to do, but don't – or to stop doing the very thing I want to stop doing, but can't – I ask the Lord to *heal* me of my *insanity*. Seriously. Using the correct term makes an *incredible difference*. Try it. And watch how it steadily changes your *thoughts*. Which gradually changes your actions. James calls this madness: double-mindedness. And says it's ...

... like a wave of the sea driven and tossed by the wind. - James 1:6 NKJ

I firmly believe that we need a wartime mindset toward sin. Aware. Prepared. Alert. A twig snaps and adrenalin rushes in! Because truly loving God means truly loathing sin. As Noah said, we're under no obligation to join forces with that sinful assassin to assist with our own destruction.

We [do] have an obligation [don't get me wrong]—but it is not to the sinful nature ... For if you live [and I use the term loosely] according to the sinful nature, you will die; [though you'll call it living] but if by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live, because those who are led by the Spirit of God [to put those misdeeds to death] are sons of God. [Even the ladies? YES! Because] ... you received the Spirit of Sonship. [So we're the body of God's Son; "There is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Gal 3:28)] And by Him we cry, "Abba, Father." – Romans 8:12-15 NIV

And that's the obligation we have: crying out for help. Because eliminating, exterminating, and eradicating "the misdeeds" is only doable "by Him" who is "the Spirit of Sonship". Because misdeeds are just the visible sin of a deeper cluster hiding within. And the old self doesn't trust that God truly is an all-loving, all-powerful Abba-Father, who always only allows what is absolutely, purposefully, unfathomably, necessary for our eternal best. And so, deep inside, it's angry at what it selfishly, ignorantly, perceives to be the Lord's deficiency. And that's why:

The sinful mind is [actually] *hostile* to God. [And *that's* why] It does not submit to *God's* law, nor *can it* do so. [How *could* it? And *that's* why] Those controlled by the sinful nature *cannot* please God. [How *could* they?] – Romans 8:7-8 NIV



That creepy cluster can only be cut down by knowing and trusting Jesus' love, over whatever lusting ol' Beelzebub's peddling. Cuz religion's rules and restrictions by willpower won't cut it. Noah compared it to the contrast between a rowboat, which we control by ourselves by our own power (just the way the sinful nature likes it), and a sailboat, which we cocontrol by setting the sail, catching the wind, and then steering the rudder. But we're fully aware that we're utterly dependent on the wind for power. Kind of like Jesus' disciples on the Day of Pentecost.

Suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a *rushing mighty wind*, and it *filled* the *whole house* ... and they were all *filled* with the Holy Spirit – Acts 2:2-4 NKJ

Because, just like a motorboat, rowboats eventually run out of gas. Whereas, a sailboat's power source is inexhaustible. So, if you're straining at the oars in your walk with the Lord, you should check your source ... and choose: set your sail to be filled with His Spirit, or be driven and tossed with double-minded madness: killing off many of the cluster flies ... but ... willingly allowing some to survive, and hide, to breed again within. Now that's nutzi! So, stop the insanity!

We gotta go *medieval* on *evil* with "the *full armor* of God". *This* sermon isn't about *putting down* the *cluster flies,* as much as *putting on* the *sweatshirt* and the *hat,* and *taking up* that *shop vac!* The "*breastplate*", "*helmet*", and "*shield*". Last week, we talked about "the *Sword* of the *Spirit,* which is the *Word* of *God*", and before that, "girding the *loins* [of our mind (1 Pet 1:13)] with *truth*", and "[fitting] our *feet* with the [*lamp* of the *prophets* who *light* a *path* to] the *Gospel*". Now let's look at "the *helmet* of *salvation*". See if you can *wrap* your *mind* around *this:*

For if, *while* we were God's *enemies*, we were *reconciled* [*cleared* of *debts*] to Him [and not only *that, but*] *through* the *death* of [*us murdering*] His *Son*, how much *more*, [then] having *been* reconciled, shall we be saved through His *life*! – Romans 5:10 NIV

He set us up, so our *redemption* would come through our *evilest* possible *act* of *sin* against *Him*, to *demonstrate* a *love* we can't *begin* to *comprehend*, which means it's *inexhaustible*, which means we *can* and *must* "take up the *shield* of *faith*", and *trust* it *completely*, which gives us the *power* to *suck up* whatever *lies fly* in our *face*. *But* it's not *just* His inconceivable *love* we must trust. *Equally* astounding is His *righteousness* that we "*put on* like a *breastplate*". *Because* ...



Those who *receive* God's *abundant* provision of *grace* and of the <u>gift of righteousness</u> [will] *reign* in *life* through [Jesus Christ]. – Romans 5:17 NIV

A <u>righteousness</u> from God, <u>apart</u> from <u>law</u>, [of <u>righteousness</u>] has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets *testify*. – Romans 3:21 NIV

[David] speaks of the *blessedness* of the man to whom <u>God credits righteousness</u> <u>apart</u> <u>from works</u> [of the *law* of *righteousness*] – Romans 4:6 NIV

But Israel, who pursued a law of righteousness, has not attained it. - Romans 9:31 NIV

Since they did not know <u>the righteousness that comes from God</u> and sought to establish their own, they did not submit to <u>God's righteousness</u>. [But you see] Christ is <u>the end of</u> the <u>law</u> [of righteousness] so that there may be <u>righteousness</u> [apart from works of the <u>law</u> of righteousness] for everyone who believes. – Romans 10:3-4 NIV

This <u>righteousness</u> from <u>God</u> comes through <u>faith</u> in Jesus Christ to <u>all</u> who believe. – Romans 3:22 NIV

Jesus turns the *law* of *religious rules* and *restrictions* on its *head*. Don't *miss* this: to *be righteous*, you had to do the deeds of the *law*. And *then* Jesus makes it a sin to even try to add to the righteousness we've been given. And that's because, the only sin I'm more powerful than, is forgiven sin. This gift that guards our heart like a breastplate, empowers us to face our failings while fearlessly assailing and sucking out whatever sin still flies in the space we've reserved for the One we've received in our heart. Because being right with God must precede doing right with God.

Think about a sailboat *race*. Same *wind*. Yet different *speeds* and *directions*. Why? Cuz our *course* and *pace* are determined by our *rudder* and the set of our *sail*.

Those who live according to the sinful nature have their minds set on what that [sinful] nature desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires. [Thus] The mind of sinful man is [set on] death, [wise ol' Solomon calls it "vanity tossed to and fro of them that seek death." (Pr 21:6)] but the mind controlled by [what] the Spirit [desires] is [set on] life and peace; – Romans 8:5-6 NIV

Our mindset *determines* our *direction* and *steers* our heart *accordingly*. The way we *think* determines the way we *feel*. And the way we *feel* determines the way we *act*. And that *rushing mighty wind* of God's *Word* determines the way we *think* ... *if* it's *treasured* within.

Ever been the victim of someone having a "bad day"? It's likely the set of their sail, or reckless rudder. Because whatever we're *open* to, will *drive* us: **open** *yourself* to the *sinful self*, be *driven* to *sinful deeds;* but, **open** *your heart* to the *heart* of *Christ*, be *carried* to *life* and *peace*.

Those who have 'set their sail' on the sinful self, ignore how we've been created to interpret true fulfillment – thinking *happiness* comes by *focusing* on *self* and *powering* through. Which is why *self-focusing* ultimately *drives* us to *self-loathing*. Which is why *wise* ol' *Solomon* said:



^{1:13} It is an *unhappy business* that God has given to *human beings* to be *busy* with. ... ^{1:14} all [*busy business*] is *vanity* and a *chasing after wind*. ... ^{1:17} I applied my *mind*[*set*] to know *wisdom and* to know *madness* and *folly* [the *nutzies*] ... this *also* is but a *chasing after wind*. ... ^{2:17} So I *hated* [the *unhappy busyness* of] *life* ... *all* is *vanity* and a *chasing after wind*. ... ^{2:26} To the *one* who *pleases* Him God gives *wisdom* and *knowledge* and *joy*; but to the *sinner* He gives the [*busy*] *work* of gathering and heaping ... this also is vanity and a *chasing after wind*. ... ^{4:4} All *toil* and all *skill* in [*busy*] *work* come from one person's *envy* of another. This *also* is vanity and a *chasing after wind*. ... ^{4:6} Better is a *handful* with *quiet* than *two handfuls* with *toil*, and a *chasing after wind*. – Ecclesiastes 1:14-4:6 NRS

Why does Paul say the self-focused mind is *hostile* to God? I know *unbelievers* who talk *favorably* about *God*. But their *thoughts* about *God*, are on *their terms*. They're seeking *the secret* of a *subservient* God. And it's all vanity and *chasing after* the wind ... in a *rowboat*. Because, it's ...

"Not by *might* nor by *power*, but by *My Spirit*," [of *Sonship* (Rom 8:15)] says the Lord Almighty. [about that rushing *mighty* wind (Acts 2:2)] – Zechariah 4:6 NIV

[So] [*Until* we reach] the *knowledge* of the *Son* of *God* and become *mature* ... [we'll be] tossed *back* and *forth* by the *waves*, **[of** *double-mindedness*] and *blown* here and there by every *wind* of *teaching* and by the *cunning* and *craftiness* of *men* – Ephesians 4:13-15 NIV

And when *rowers* run out of *gas*, they're *dead* in the *water*. Cuz, "the *sinful nature* cannot *please* God". Nor find the *surpassing peace* that *accompanies* our *created purpose*. So **if I live to please** *me*, I *can't please* God *or myself*. Whereas, **if I live to please** *God*, I *please* **my Lord** *and* **myself**!

[Now] [Moses] persevered because he *saw* Him who is *invisible*. – Hebrews 11:27 NIV

[And] Under His feet was something ... as bright blue as the sky. – Exodus 24:9-10 NIV

That was the true Light which gives light to every man – John 1:9 NKJ

As a *fragrant offering* and *sacrifice* to God. – Ephesians 5:2 NIV

[But as wise ol' Solomon warns] Dead flies give perfume a bad smell – Ecclesiastes 10:1 NIV

[So] Remember *all* the commands of the *Lord,* that you may obey *them* and not *prostitute* yourselves by *chasing after* the *lusts* of your *own hearts* – Numbers 15:39 NIV

[And] ³ *Trust* in the Lord ... ⁴ *Delight* yourself *also* in the Lord ... ⁵ Commit your *way* to the Lord ... ⁷ Rest in the Lord, and wait patiently ... ⁸ *Cease* from *anger*, and *forsake wrath;* do not *fret*—it only causes *harm*. ... ¹⁵ [*That*] sword shall enter their *own* heart ... ²⁸ For the Lord loves *justice*, and does *not* forsake His *saints* ... ³¹ The *law* of his *God* [a.k.a. the *Sword* of the *Spirit*] is in [*their*] heart; ... ³⁹ [Which is *why* and *how*] *He* is their *strength* in the time of trouble. – Psalm 37:3-39 NKJ condensed

Which is why, we won't make peace with God without making war with sin. Because, this *battle* is how He *builds* our *desire* and *determination*, and ultimately *self-discipline*, to *reject wonderfully* packaged *wickedness* in *exchange* for *blue skies*, *open seas*, and a *Light breeze*. All *we* need to *do* is to *open* our *mind* and our *heart* ... and *read* the *wind*.

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
