Universal Outsider

A Disarming Tour of Your Heart February 19, 2023

Today we're talking about our role as insiders ... to outsiders.

So the obvious opening question would be: **Are** *you* **an** *insider* **or an** *outsider***?** Though I *was* torn between *that* and the much *less obvious* question: **How do you** *taste***?** But, Paul writes:



We urge you, *brothers* and *sisters*, [i.e. *insiders*] to [love each other] more and more, *and* to make it your *ambition* to lead a quiet life: [i.e.] You should mind your own business ... so that your daily life may *win* the *respect* of *outsiders* – 1 Thessalonians 4:9-12 NIV

For what have I to do with judging *outsiders*? Is it not those *inside* the church whom you are to *judge*? God judges those *outside*. -1 Corinthians 5:12-13 ESV

When I was eighteen, I went to California with two friends and a naughty plan. We took the Universal Studios tour and, when nobody was looking, ducked behind the amphitheater, changed into coveralls, held a couple hammers (to look like workers), and gave ourselves the best backlot tour ever! We explored the Munster's mansion, Beaver Cleaver's house, and warehouses filled with props and equipment. But after a few hours we noticed a lot of patrol cars cruising around. And teams of security guards searching the buildings. And cop cars blocking the exits. We were trapped! No escape. We couldn't make a move without being seen. So we walked to a squad car and asked for directions. this is the cop who hauled us in ... and this is the chief who questioned us. And this is where I learned that Universal City had an actual police force! They mainly wanted to know if we'd vandalized any property. Which we hadn't. Though the hammers needed some explanation. But once they concluded that we were simply idiots, they released us - which is when I asked the officers if I could take their pictures, further *confirming* their *conclusion*.

We asked what had tipped 'em off. And they said they'd received several calls about three guys **trying too hard to** *look* **like** *workers*. Turns out, **the** *real workers* just look like *regular people*. Well, don't look *now*, but *you're* surrounded. Can't *escape* it. A lot of people are patrolling your *home*, your *workplace*, and wherever you *hangout*, **trying to** *figure out* **if you're** *legit*, *authentic*, and *sincere*, or just an undercover *outsider* trying to look the *part*. You know, there's a way we could've achieved our goal with full approval: apply for a *job*! Become an actual *functioning member* of the *crew*. But we weren't interested in making a *legitimate team effort*. We just wanted an outsider's *artificial*, *superficial*, *shortcut*.

Which is sadly similar to something we can do with our *faith*, and *especially* our *place* in the body of Christ. But not *you*. Not *here*. Because, as the Apostle Paul put it:



We are *not*, as so many, *peddling* the Word of God; but as of *sincerity*, but as *from God*, we speak in the *sight* of *God* in *Christ*. ... Clearly *you* are an *epistle* [i.e. a letter] of Christ ... written *not* with *ink* but by the Spirit of the *living* God, not on tablets of *stone* but on tablets of *flesh*, that is, of the *heart*. – 2 Corinthians 2:17; 3:3 NKJ

And you can't fake that. Cuz onlookers guard their hearts, and patrol for pretenders. It's universal. Try to tell 'em you've found the way, the truth, and the life, and they'll say, "Yeah. You and everyone else." Cuz talk is cheap and there's a lot of bad eggs. That's another universal truth in this world. So, as a sincere insider, you need to:

Be *wise* in the *way* you *act* toward *outsiders*; [and] make the *most* of *every* opportunity. – Colossians 4:5 NIV

"To accomplish *what,* exactly?" *Mostly* to *intentionally* provide an *opportunity* to *allow* them to:

Taste and see that the Lord is good – Psalm 34:8 NIV

So, how do you *taste*? Hopefully like an honest-to-goodness *insider*. A *good egg*. Because *you* are the *letter* the Lord is *writing* to those *around* you, that He's reaching *out* to. You're *it*.

"Would you give [your son] a scorpion when he asks for an *egg*? Bad as you *are*, you *know* how to give *good* things ... how much *more*, then, will *the* Father" – Luke 11:11-13 GNT

[But] Is there any *taste* in the white of an *egg?* [Not much] – Job 6:6b NKJ

[And] Can flavorless food be eaten without salt? [Not satisfyingly] – Job 6:6a NKJ

[Well] "You are the salt of the earth" – Matthew 5:13 NKJ

[So] "Have salt in yourselves, and have peace with one another." – Mark 9:50 NKJ

[For] "Salt is good; but if salt has lost its taste ... it is fit neither for the soil [which, in the parable of The Sower, symbolizes our heart, wherein God's Word is planted] nor for the manure pile; they [on the receiving end, just] throw it away." – Luke 14:34-35 NRS

Cuz outsiders can tell the difference between well-seasoned words of *life*, and b.s.

[So] Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. [How?] Let your conversation be <u>always full of grace</u>, [i.e.] <u>seasoned with salt</u>, so that you may know [not necessarily what, but] how to answer everyone. – Colossians 4:2-6 NIV

For the ear tests words as the tongue tastes food. – Job 34:3 NIV

So put away all *malice* and all *deceit* and *hypocrisy* and *envy* and all *slander* ... <u>grow up</u> <u>into salvation</u>— if *indeed* you *have* tasted that the *Lord* is good. – 1 Peter 2:1-3 ESV

... and have tasted the goodness of the Word of God – Hebrews 6:5 ESV

When we come together on Sunday morning, it's more than just a time of *celebration*, and *worship*, and *teaching*. If we're "growing up" we're *creating* a *loving*, *caring*, *family feeling*.

Stretching out His hand toward His disciples, [Jesus] said, "Behold, My mother and My brothers! For whoever does the will of My *Father* who is in *heaven*, [which is to be *like* His *Son* on *earth*] he is My brother and sister and mother." – Matthew 12:49-50 NAS



When people visit here it should feel like home, **due to the collective effect of what each of us bring to the table.** And I *love it* when someone cases the place and comments on your *warmth* and *love* and *humor* and *humility*. **Cuz we're not peddling God's Word, we're living it.**

It's not a *fluke* that *humor* and *humility* come from the same root word. Learn to *laugh* – especially at *yourself* – and you'll find others coming to *you* to be refreshed. I've found that the more *seriously* we take the *Lord*, the *less* seriously we take *ourselves*. After all, as they say: we're all *here* cuz we ain't all *there!* And the more *formal* the *setting*, the more anxious the *onlookers;* and the *less* likely to *let down* their *guard*. Which is why we need to be the *antidote* to *formality*. Because:

Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty. - 2 Corinthians 3:17 NKJ

Stand fast therefore in the *liberty* by which Christ has *made* us *free*, and do not be entangled again with a *yoke* of bondage. [*Pun intended*] – Galatians 5:1 NKJ

[For you] have been *called* to *liberty*; only do not use *liberty* as an *opportunity* for the *flesh*, but through *love* [and *liberty*] *serve* one another. – Galatians 5:13 NKJ

For *this* is the will of *God*, that by doing *good* you may put to *silence* the *ignorance* of foolish men— as *free*, yet *not* using *liberty* as a cloak for *vice* – 1 Peter 2:15-16 NKJ

"Because [as Jesus declared in His own hometown church] [the Spirit of the Lord] has anointed Me to *preach* the *Gospel* ... to *heal* the *brokenhearted*, to proclaim *liberty* to the *captives* and ... to *set* at *liberty* those who are *oppressed*" – Luke 4:18 NKJ



And *that liberty* disarms the universal defenses of those with closed hearts. So, your *home*, your *car*, your *place* of *work*, your *school*, and your *wherever*, but *especially* your *church*, should be an *oasis* in this *parched* old *world*. Because our *Creator*, *Lord*, and *Savior* said:

"If anyone *thirsts*, let him *come* to Me and *drink*. [And] He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of *his heart* will flow rivers of *living water*." – John 7:37-39 NKJ

For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks. - Matthew 12:34 NKJ

[And] A healed tongue is a tree of life – Proverbs 15:4 YLT

[Which is why] A cheerful heart is good medicine – Proverbs 17:22 NIV

Noah and I aren't into being called "pastor", so new folks often ask how they should refer to me. I like to say, "My *friends* call me Bruce." Then when they say, "O.K. Bruce," I say, "But I *prefer* pastor." Then when they say, "Sure pastor," I say, "You don't want to be my friend?" Then they leave the church. So I should stop doing that. We don't have a problem with the title of our vocation, just with believers *avoiding* their *responsibilities* by *projecting* 'em onto *us*. Jesus said:

"Don't ever let anyone call you 'Rabbi,' [to *exalt* you] for you have only *one Teacher*, and all of you are on the *same level* ... But those who *exalt* themselves will be *humbled*, and those who *humble* themselves will be *exalted*." – Matthew 23:8-12 NLT

A humble pastor was on his knees in his church praying, "O Lord, I'm nothing." A deacon saw him and joined in, "O Lord, I'm nothing." Then the janitor, humbled by the sight, joined them: "O Lord, I'm nothing." And the deacon whispers to the pastor, "Look who thinks *he*'s nothing!"

The only time Jesus describes *Himself*, know what He says?

"Learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart" – Matthew 11:29 NIV

So, I'll see your pastor and raise you a priest! Because:

[Jesus] has made us [all] kings and priests to His God and Father – Revelation 1:6 NKJ

If this is your place of worship, then **this is your** *house*, and you're the *host*. Whether you want to admit it or not. You might be a *bad* host – but you're still *the host*. Onlookers and outsiders will only see Jesus to the degree that He can speak and act through *you*. You're *it*. I can only do so much up here yapping for 25 minutes. The real test is how we all treat 'em when I'm not teaching.

And don't look *now*, but some of 'em are in here, *right now*. *Watching*. Trying to get a read on the *room*. And **they're** *mostly* **looking at** *you*, **to see if the** *claims* **of** *Christ* **are** *true*. And Jesus promises to *speak* to their *heart*, if you'll *open* your *mouth*; and to *encourage* and *comfort* 'em, if you'll *approach* 'em; and to *clean* 'em up and *care* for 'em, if you'll *serve* 'em in some *small* way.



[Jesus] began to wash His disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around Him. ... [And said] "Now that I, your *Lord* and *Teacher*, have washed *your* feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have *set* you an *example*" – John 13:4-15 NIV

And it's not like He even asks for all that *much*. So, **if you're part of His body, you gotta take ownership**, in what He's doing *here* and *everywhere* you *live out* your *faith*. We're called to be a *"living* sacrifice", **which often means sacrificing** *comfort* and *shyness* and *fear* of *rejection*, in order to wrap that towel around your waste ... and stop wasting your opportunities.

Cuz that's how we grow up in our salvation.

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
