## God-Given Name

*Eyes to See Your Significance* March 12, 2023

Today we're talking about coming to be known by our most intimate name.

With that said: What's your God-given name? Don't answer just yet.

In regard to a very *specific* and *significant miracle*, which we'll get to in a moment, Jesus said:



"[The Shepherd] <u>calls his own sheep by name</u> and ... I am the *Good Shepherd;* I *know* My *sheep* and My *sheep* know *Me*" – John 10:3, 14 NIV

The first time I met Matt Damon was in this crowded hotel room in LA; and as I *nervously* made my *way* to *introduce* myself, he suddenly *sees* me and says, "Bruce! Where's Ken?!" Talk about a *shock!* They'd flown us to LA, in the top 10 of a film-making competition created by Matt, Ben, and Miramax. So, Matt *glances* around the room, *spots* Ken, *calls* him over, and *tells* us how excited *he* is to meet *us*, and kind of *giggles* about how, when we *entered* the *lobby*, everyone got a *notice* in their *earpiece* that "*Ken* and *Bruce* are *in* the building." It's weird, but having someone *so* well-known, *know* your *name*, brings a *strange sense* of *secular significance*.

So, if you have a tendency to feel *insignificant, irrelevant,* or somehow *spiritually marginalized,* keep in mind that **the Creator and** *sustainer* **of** *eternal time, space,* and *dimension,* knows *your name!* And He's *genuinely excited* to see you *face* to *face.* Just imagine *His greeting* as you enter *His presence!* I can *hear* it now: "Bruce! Where's Ken?!"

Now, once upon a time – in real life, 2,000 years ago – a Jewish baby boy was born *blind*. He was *told* he was *cursed* by *God*; and as an adult, he resorted to begging. And yet, he *leaned* into *God*, and *learned* His *Word*, and *stored* it up in his *heart*, all the while no-doubt *struggling* with his seeming insignificance, and wondering why a good God would overlook him. How could he know that God had actually *chosen* him and *prepared* him to play a *pivotal role* in the *Gospel* regarding the *foremost proof* of Jesus' *claims* to be the *Christ* – the one Messiah-establishing miracle, according to Scripture: opening blind eyes. (Is 29:18, 35:5) Let's start with the *punchline*.

Now it was a Sabbath day when Jesus made the clay and opened his eyes. - John 9:14 RSV



And believe it or not, you could be *stoned* for making *mud* or *clay* on the *Sabbath*. (Ex 35:2) Even if it was to obey the greater commandment to love. *Nobody* could work *during* the *day;* but that *night* the market came to *life*. You need to *know* this to get *Jesus'* Sabbath *word-play,* just before He *heals* this man, *while* on the *run* from being *stoned*.

They picked up stones to stone Him, but Jesus hid himself, slipping away from the temple grounds. [And] As He went along, He saw a man [known to be] blind from birth. [And He *stopped* and *stared*, and] His disciples asked Him, "Rabbi, who *sinned*, this *man* or his *parents*, that he was *born* blind?" [The religious rulers taught you could *sin in* the *womb*, to *explain how* you could come out *cursed* ... *legalism* at its *finest!*] "Neither this *man* nor his *parents* sinned," said Jesus, "but *this* happened *so that* the work of God might be displayed in his life. [Here's the *word-play*] As long as it is *day*, *we* must do the *work* of Him who *sent Me*. [Sending out *this guy* on *this day*] *Night* is *coming*, when *no one* can *work*. [Just before He's *betrayed*, *tried*, and *crucified*, Scripture says: "It was *night*". (Jn 13:30) But] While I am *in* the world, I am the *light of* the world." – John 8:59-9:5 NIV

[As opposed to all those] ... having their *understanding darkened* ... because of the *ignorance* that is *in* them, because of the *blindness* of their *heart* – Ephesians 4:18 NKJ

These people come near to Me with their *mouth* ... but their *hearts* are far from Me. <u>Their worship of Me is made up only of rules taught by men</u>. ... [Woe to those] who do their work in darkness [of heart] and think, "Who sees us?" ... as if the potter were thought to be like the *clay*! ... <u>Out of gloom and darkness the eyes of the blind will see</u>. ... and all who have an *eye* for *evil* will be *cut down* – Isaiah 29:13-20 NIV



[Now] When He had said these things, [to His *disciples*, and *called* to the *blind beggar*] He *spat* on the *ground* and *made clay* with the *saliva*; and He *anointed* the *eyes* of the *blind* man *with* the *clay*. And He said to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which is translated, *Sent*). So he *went* and *washed*, and came back *seeing*. – John 9:6-7 NKJ

To put it *mildly*! In 2004, sewer repairs led to the discovery of the one and only Pool of Siloam! **This is** *the place* where the blind man waded in and washed his eyes! Because *this* was the *gathering place* for *Jews* to ritually *cleanse* before *going up* to the **Temple over a** *quarter-mile* away! Jesus bathed here when He was twelve! And guess what they found on the far end, there: the steps going up to the Temple! The entire quarter-mile length has now been excavated, though they've only uncovered 6' of the 25' width of the steps. Notice how they're not only set *askew*, but have differing *depths*. This was done to keep people from rushing, and to remind 'em to bow their *heads* as they approached the Temple. But it *sure* made it *tough* for a *blind* man, *called* near the Temple and *sent* to make his way to that pool.

Nothing about this is ADA approved! But the mud turns the man into an attention-grabbing, Sabbath-violating megaphone as he stumbles down that long flight of steps. Cuz no one'll help him for fear of excommunication. So imagine the commotion of this ever-growing Jesus-made-parade of the blind (literally) leading the blind (spiritually), drawing everyone along this 25' wide, precarious quarter-mile descent, to see if God's gonna reveal the Messiah by curing the man He supposedly cursed from birth, whose eyes are now caked with clay that's supposedly part earth and part Potter! Know what's not a Sabbath violation? Yelling out: "Short step! Short step! Long step!" And then, the pool. And then, they see: the Messiah-proving miracle!



But, while blindly descending those steps alone, what's going through his mind? "God *finally* shows up ... just to rub mud on my face and leave me tripping down a treacherous religious stairway?" Now, **he wasn't** *abandoned* by God, he was *sent*, which, to be honest, can *feel* the *same*. Which is why you *need* to *know* that *He* knows you by *name*. So the next time you're sent *blindly groping* for *answers*, know that you're *part* of a *grand plan*; and *glorify* God *as* you make your way along. Cuz, *after* the *pool*, it only gets *worse* for this *guy*. And yet, his *countenance* is so *radically changed*, he has a hard time *convincing* his friends it's him.

But he himself insisted, "I am the man." "How then were your eyes opened?" they demanded. He replied, "The man they call Jesus made some mud and put it on my eyes. He told me to go to Siloam and wash. So I went and washed, and then I could see." "Where is this man?" they asked him. [Cuz they have to report the violation for fear of excommunication] "I don't know," he said. ["I was blind!"] [So] They brought [*him*] to the Pharisees ... [who] also asked him how he had received his sight. "He put mud on my eyes ... and I washed, and now I see." Some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, for He does not keep the Sabbath." [Cuz according to religious hypocrisy, making mud is much worse than picking up stones to throw!] But others [thought He was from God, and] asked, "How can a sinner do such miraculous signs?" So they were [a house] divided. ... They sent for the man's parents. "Is this your son?" they asked. ... "We know he is our son ... and we know he was born blind. But how he can see now, or who opened his eyes, we don't know. Ask him." ... His parents said this because they were afraid of the Jews, Jesus said, "You will be betrayed even by parents ... and you will be hated by all for My name's sake." (Lk 21:16-17)] for ... anyone who acknowledged that Jesus was the Christ would be put out of the synagogue. Blind religion denies his parents the joy of their own son's sight!] ... A second time they summoned the man ... [and] said. "We know this man is a sinner." [Cuz He made mud] He replied, "Whether He is a sinner [for making mud] or not, I don't know. One thing I do know. I was blind [at the time] but now I see!" [This beggar is no *pushover!* But they couldn't hurl *stones* at *him,* so] ... they hurled *insults* at him and said ... "We know that God spoke to Moses, but as for this fellow, we don't even know where He comes from." [Being divided whether He's from God or the devil – even though He did the undisputed Messiah-proving miracle. And this is moment the un-blind man was born for, cuz he's living proof! And he knows God's Word! And as every peer pressures him to denounce Jesus, he instead defends Him!] The man answered, "Now that is remarkable! You don't know where He comes from, yet He opened my eyes. [Fulfilling God's promise to Isaiah (29:18, 35:2-5)] We know [from Isaiah (1:15); Jeremiah (11:11); Ezekiel (8:18); and Mica (3:4)] that God does not listen to sinners. He listens to the godly man who does His will. Nobody has ever heard of opening the eyes of a man born blind. [Come on!] If this man were not from God, He could do nothing." To this they replied, "You were steeped in sin at birth; how dare you lecture us!" And they threw him out. [And when] Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, [He sought out His brave little lamb] and when He found him, [instead of *telling* him *He's* the One who *healed* him] He said, "Do you *believe* in the *Son* of Man?" [a name for God-the-Messiah, in Daniel 7:13-14] "Who is He, Sir?" the man asked. [Not "What is He?" but "Where is He?" as in, "Point Him out"] "Tell me so that I may believe in Him." Jesus said, "You [Mr. Living Proof] have now seen him; in fact, He is the one speaking with you." Then [recognizing His voice] the man said, "Lord, I believe," and he worshiped Him. – John 9:8-38 NIV

And this is when Jesus said, "I tell you the truth" ...



"The <u>watchman</u> [which is an OT name (Is 21:6) for *prophets* like *Isaiah*, *Jeremiah*, *Ezekiel*, and *Mica*] opens the gate for [the shepherd], and the sheep *listen to* his voice. [*in* His Word; and] He calls his own sheep by name and *leads* them *out* [of *vain*, *rules-based religion* into a *living relationship*] ... and his sheep follow him because they *know* his voice. [*from* His Word] ... I am the Good Shepherd; I *know* My *sheep* and My *sheep* know *Me* – John 10:3-4, 14 NIV

This is me at my Grandma-Mom's house. All that's missing, to complete the picture, is an empty carton of Pall-Malls ... and three somewhat hideous, flatulent bulldogs, that my grandma *loved*, and *cared for*, and *cooked for*, and named: *Lacy, Jo-Jo*, and *Tami*. And in Jesus' day, flocks were small and individually named, like pets. But their names corresponded to their traits. Instead of Fluffy, Puffy, or Tami, it'd be a name like Stubborn, Timid, Feisty, or Dumdum. And Jesus does the *same* with each of His sheep. Cuz the Lord loves Him some *nicknames!* He called Simon, the *zealot;* Thomas, the *twin;* James and John, the *sons of thunder;* and Peter, the *rock* ... *and Satan*. (Mk 3:16-18, 8:33; Jn 21:2) The question is: What's your God-given name? *Grumpy? Happy? Dopey?* 

By the way, the next time you see Ben Affleck you can tell your friends he kind'a knows you; cuz, *here's* a video where he's kind'a *bragging* about our Ark! It's one thing to know a *celebrity* knows your *flock;* it's another *entirely* to know **our** *Creator* knows you by your most personal **pet name.** Whether it's *Ol' Faithful*, or *Crusty*, or *Cowardly*, or *Living Proof!* After calling himself the Good Shepherd – one of *His* many nicknames – Jesus went on to say:

My sheep listen to My voice ... and they follow Me. ... [And] Again the Jews picked up stones to stone Him, but Jesus said ... "For which of these [miracles] do you stone Me?" "We are not stoning You for any of these ... [but] because You, a mere Man, claim to be God." Jesus answered them, "Is it not written in your Law, 'I have *said* you are *gods*'? [Ps 82:6] ... <u>He called them 'gods,' to whom the Word of God came</u> – John 10:27-35 NIV

Well, good morning little gods. Has the Word of God come to you - and into you?

The Lord knows those who are His, and, everyone who names the name of the Lord is to abstain from wickedness. – 2 Timothy 2:19 NAS

For the Lord God will ... call His servants by another name – Isaiah 65:15 NKJ

"No longer do I call you servants ... I have called you friends" – John 15:15 NKJ

And friends use special names. Which is why Jesus *still* asks each of us: "Who do *you* say I am?" (Lk 9:20) Because, **the Lord can't be your Shepherd, till the Shepherd is your Lord.** And you *learn* to *listen* to His *voice* in His *Word* – which is **the one gift you** *open* with your *eyes.* Cuz *that's* when He calls you *friend.* No matter how long you might have to blindly grope along.

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
