The Big Picture

Part IV: Sensibly Seeing Our Destiny

Today we're looking for the last piece of a working worldview to *complete* a story that actually makes *sense* of our life – *and* all its non-stop chaos and confusion. Because, to really *get* what's going on down here, we gotta find *reasonable* answers that explain our origin, meaning, morality, and destiny. And after dealing with *three*, it's time to talk destiny so we can finally *see* the big picture from beginning to *end*, and judge for ourselves: are our answers *rational* and *realistic?* So let's *start* with *the* question *from* the finish: **How does your story** *end?*



This is the most important question to consider, cuz its answer is what everything in every story is all about. It's the X that marks the spot we're trying to get to; making it the reason behind all our actions. It's the final piece of the puzzle that pulls everything together so we can see the big picture. And it's the payoff that proves whatever we did, actually worked out! And how a story ends, is what we use to judge if the book was worth the read. And in the exact same way, whatever we believe to be our ending, has the power to change how we see the rest of our story.



For example, imagine two passengers on the *same* plane to Chicago. 22A is on his way home to a wife and kids after being deployed for 18 months overseas. So how's the trip? And the *turbulence?* Well, *great!* Every *minute* is eager *excitement* because all he's thinking about is what's waiting once he's off the plane! And the turbulence is *no* big deal if it's what you *gotta* go through to get home! He just wants to finish the flight! But now consider seat *22B*. He's on the *same* flight to the *same* place, but Chicago is *not* his home. It's where his mother's *funeral* is being held. So how's *his* trip? And *his* turbulence? *Awful*. Every minute is *agony* he wants to *avoid* because all he's thinking about is what's waiting for him once he's off the plane. And the *turbulence* keeps turning *his* thoughts to his *own* death. And yet, he *doesn't* want the painful flight to *end* because *that's* when he'll have to confront an even *worse reality*.

Well, **this life is our plane!** Down here, we all got on at birth and we're riding **together** till death do us part. And we all **have to** wonder, **what's waiting once we're off the plane? That's** the worldview question of **destiny** that we all have to answer. And since we've been talking through the steps that moved **me** from the **secular** side into the **Christian** camp, I want to you to hear the honest answer to our **destiny** that the **'science-says'** worldview says is waiting at the end of our flight: **Death**.

No *if's*, *and's*, or *but's*. You become a pile of *worm food* and *fertilizer* and there is *no* more *'you'* in the universe. Elvis has *left* the building. You're *bereft* of life and ceased to *be*. You *are* an *ex*-human.



Some ending, huh? It's like searching every page of Where's Waldo and finally coming to the end to find it says, "There is no Waldo." Really?! That's a book worth reading? And calling it Where's Waldo is at least misleading if not totally dishonest. And I'd feel like I got cheated by an author who wanted to waste my time just to be a jerk! And that's how I felt when I discovered atheists have a set of answers that say there is no answer. What was the point of saying anything?

And suddenly, I realized, there wasn't a point; and they knew that. Hawking, Dawkins, Nietzsche, and the rest were way too smart to miss the meaninglessness of all their tireless work, so why did they do it? Why bother if it didn't matter? Because they did have a purpose! Those liars! Nobody would ever actually read Where's Waldo without believing there was a Waldo; just like no one would ever actually live life without believing there was a truth! Sure we can say it's what we believe, but what a person really thinks deep down shows up in their actions. Cuz what we actually do reveals what we actually believe. The proof is in the pudding, and from secular philosopher to committed Christian, everyone gets up every day to do things that reveal we all feel there is something that makes our story worth reading and makes our life worth living. And there's an ending we're wired to want even though it's absolutely unnatural by earthly standards; "and they all lived happily ever after." Because that ending gives us something that is as critical to life as food, water, and shelter. Hope. Hope is the force behind everything we do, and without it, we wouldn't do anything! And we wouldn't have hope if we really believed death was our destiny.

So because we all *live lives* like they have meaning, there *must* be a *reason* that **deep down we** *don't* believe death is our destiny! And the Christians were like, "Pick us! We know this one!" –

[As a Christian] Your faith and love have arisen from the hope laid up for you in Heaven, which you have heard about in the message of truth, the Gospel – Colossians 1:5 NET

Christians live like life has meaning cuz they read the book that promised our trip down here is headed home to a life full of family and not a funeral full of death. And they trust it because it also made sense of all the other stuff we've all experienced. And since that ending has the power to change the heart of every passenger on the flight, the book itself says to share the big secret!

Always be prepared to give an answer to *everyone* who asks you to give the *reason* for the hope that you have. -1 Peter 3:15 NIV

And here's why it works that way: to fix our flaw we have to want that reason! Back in the beginning, we rejected what God offered as our destiny – so to get it back, we have to learn to really want it! We have to see it's God's Word that completes the big picture of perfection! Ya get it?! The partial picture is a setup! This life is supposed to be chaos and confusion – because He's showing us what happens when we're in charge. And He's letting us live life on our own so that what we experience would lead us to crave what we're missing... Him!



Cuz whether it's what we've *seen* in His creation, what we've *felt* through His Spirit or what we've *heard* from His Word – **everything in this life is a shadow to get us to go find what's behind**. I love this illustration – cuz it shows how necessary each perspective is in seeing the real thing.

And like a good *teacher*, God's gonna do what it takes to get us to see *the* real thing for ourselves. Cuz like a bad student, we wouldn't take Him at His Word. So God gave us this life to teach us our lesson; because life is a teacher we can't tune out! And actions speak louder than words!

For it is God's will that by *doing* good you should silence the ignorant talk of foolish people. -1 Peter 2:15 NIV

And thanks to the atheists I discovered that **what we do could even silence ourselves!** Cuz the whole secular gang *keeps* working *every* day to prove that their beliefs are *right*, *true*, and *important* – even though *those* beliefs state *nothing* is objectively *right*, *true*, or *important!* And they're not just *silencing themselves*; their actions prove that they *too*, want to pursue that hidden hope of a better destiny. And the same went for *me*. Even as I *argued* atheism against Christianity, I was *living* like I had a *hope*. I liked *good* things, I felt a *purpose*, and I was looking for *love*. All because deep down, I *knew* this life was meant for more than death.

But why couldn't I build those beliefs into a reasonable Christian worldview that worked out on paper so I could win all the arguments. Well, I finally saw problem with that approach: I'd be the boss. Demanding to know before I trust and obey was making God meet my standard and that meant I still suffered from the fatal flaw I'm here to fix; believing I'm the authority on truth.



And I never thought it would be the good in *my* own life that would shut up *my* own ignorance. But the more I just lived like there *was* the happily ever after life that God promised – the more I started seeing things like love, truth, peace, and joy. And those *shadows* of the *real* thing behind everything began to add up for me. And as each experience grew my view, God built my faith in the big picture He painted of our *true* destiny.

[Because] Faith is the *substance* of things *hoped* for, the evidence of things not seen. – Hebrews 11:1 NKJ

Look, there's no better substance than personal experience to build our beliefs – and God's so clever, He found a way that every day, we'll produce another pile of evidence. And here's what all that experience teaches: Every bit of hopeless pain and consuming confusion comes from trying to live with fake truth. Cuz just like eating fake food, it's hard to swallow, it makes you sick to your stomach, and it can't satisfy your hunger. And yet we all have an appetite that we can't ignore!

We're wired to want answers because it's how **God keeps us focused on fixing our flaw to get us back home.** Because He loves His kids. And He comes after the lost – and that's every one of us Prodigal kids who ever left home; from angry atheist to confused Christian.

So if you or someone you know is struggling with *any* of the same stuff I've shared in this miniseries, I want to encourage you to finish what God started with a few reminders:

- 1. Be ready to be changed. Remember *truth* is true regardless of what you *want* to be true. Use that confidence to challenge your worldview, trusting that real truth will surface. God won't break and neither will you. So allow yourself to be built up by God's truth as your perspective grows each day it's called spiritual growth and that's the meaning of life! So be willing to let go of any comfortable answers when better ones come to light.
- **2. Grab what's good!** Lean into your instinct to go after what's good. You are in this place to get something meaningful *accomplished*, so **go do it!** Question and challenge *everything* but seek and serve the good stuff only. This life is ready to teach what we're looking for when we're willing to plug in and play out the truth that produces good fruit.
- **3. Live a life of love.** If love leads to living the life of perfection then **don't ever do another thing without love.** You sent an email where was the love? You went to the grocery store where was the love? You made tacos for dinner where was the love?! Practice what He commands to see if it produces what He promised; that's the scientific method for crying out loud!
- 4. Heal hurt with hope! Keep your focus fixed on the finish! Don't forget, life's up there while death's down here. And life provides the purpose behind everything we're experiencing in the big picture. And purpose is the ultimate painkiller. Because it gives us a good reason to get through the tough stuff that hurts to learn. From forgiving a friend to having a baby keeping our eyes on the prize empowers us to push through!
- 5. Remove fear from your faith. If you move into the Christian camp don't avoid discussions of science and philosophy because you're afraid of atheist answers. Remember, it requires the same faith to say there's nothing that it does to say there's something. And if anyone tells you the sciences have proven Christians wrong kindly remind them that two out of three Nobel Prize winners of the 20th c. would disagree; along with the guys who proposed the Big Bang, the model of our solar system, and the entire field of quantum mechanics! So pump the brakes.
- **6. Make things make sense.** Remember, becoming a Christian doesn't get you off the intellectual hook! We shouldn't just be confident; we should be compelling! If God is indeed the truth behind life that explains everything, **our job is to ask, seek, and knock for those answers!** We have all been born with an instinct to extract truth, a life to experience truth, and a Bible to explain truth. So wrestle with your beliefs until they make sense because *truth does*.
- **7. Act now!** Stop talking and start walking that's where we really learn life's lessons. And God designed things that way so that you'd get home with no delay. So:

Encourage one another daily, as long as it is called "Today," so that none of you may be hardened by sin's deceitfulness [that's the fake truth]. We have come to share in Christ [that's real truth], if indeed we hold our original conviction [to love God and all His kids] firmly to the very end. — Hebrews 3:12-14 NIV

So go get 'em! Cuz as Spurgeon said, "No man ever served God by doing things tomorrow."
