
## Plug and Pray

Filling Prayer With Feeling

Because, to *recap*: **prayer is a partnership**. And its purpose is to get *us* to open the door and receive *God's* unexpected answers. Which is why **we need to listen more than speak in prayer**. And as the story of the sneaky woman showed us, **we listen through God's Word** – so we can *act out* our *faith* in His *answer*. And the resulting relationship creates such a powerful picture of who God really *is*, that His reputation becomes more *respected* and *revered* than all others on earth. And **as His name is hallowed, we are humbled** – because even in His *infinite authority*, He calls us into *individual* intimacy – by revealing that **every prayer's ultimate answer is our undeserved adoption** as the earthly children of a *heavenly* Father. Because prayer lets us:

<u>See what great love the Father has lavished on us</u>, that we should be called children of God! And that *is* what we are! [And *knowing* that is *everything!*] – 1 John 3:1 NIV

Cuz when we finally see that all of this down here is just part of our Dad's plan to reveal His love for us, we see what it really means to love Him back. And that completes His plan to get us back – cuz to have a forever relationship:


Love must be sincere. [And back in the beginning, ours wasn't. So we're here to become sincere by learning why we love and what we love in a two-step process:] Hate what is evil; [and] cling to what is good. – Romans 12:9 NIV

And prayer is our tool to develop that discerning heart that can rightly divide good and evil because it gives us access to our Partner's perspective. And in all things, before we judge anything, we should double check with the view from above to see what to love! Cuz sometimes a better perspective reveals how losing your job, twisting your ankle, or getting a ticket was a good thing!

So, knowing that we *routinely* need to consult *God's perspective* on all the events of *our life*, Jesus provided a way to pray where the whole purpose is to deliver that perspective – personally and promptly. And we call it The Lord's Prayer. But as we've seen, The Lord's Prayer is not a prayer. It's a guide. A pattern. A template. A tool. It's an index that makes it easy to *plug in* all the personal experiences of our daily lives so we can *pray to* our Partner with the confidence of knowing we've asked for *His input* on everything He *wants* in on; from our *deepest needs* and *darkest secrets* to our *highest hopes* and most *passionate praise*. And yet, it's so simple, kids of all ages can use it.

In fact, it's a lot like Mad-Libs – remember those? You get a *template* full of blank spaces where *you*'re given a *prompt* to provide some *missing words* and, in the end, the *result* is always a one-of-a-kind, hilariously *personalized* paragraph that actually says a lot about who *you are!* 







So when we're *prompted* to **pray** a piece like "Our Father" – our job is to provide our perspective; i.e. to **personalize** that prompt. How would you say that and what does it mean to you where you're at. And once you've filled in that blank, we **pause** to hear what God has to say in response.



And then it's game on! Because praying that way keeps us engaged by keeping prayer fresh, dynamic, and relevant. And that draws us in rather than tuning us out. Which is why Jesus' young apprentices were so eager to learn it. It was the antidote to the mechanical, religious repetition that they were used to in long-winded Jewish prayers like the Amidah.



Cuz **it's quick and simple but** *keeps* **prayers comprehensive and concise.** And when practiced *properly*, it *promises* to produce all the fruit God's been trying to get *you* to *grow*. So what do you say we put it all together and take a practice run through the whole thing just for fun? Here we go – our first prompt is to think about where you are *right now* and –

Pray: "Our Father" – because He's your Dad! And what that means to you, we put into words to – Personalize: How do I best express my childlike affection for my devoted Dad? "Love you Pops!" "Mornin' Father", "Hey Dad – it's your favorite kid calling!" Just be natural – and then – Pause: Listen to hear what He has to say about this relationship. Maybe it felt weird to call Him Dad; or call yourself a kid. Why? Well open His Word and let Him show you how to get on the same page.

Then, we Pray: "In heaven," – because our prayer Partner is above all, and in full control.

Personalize: How do I best express my respect for Dad's absolute authority? "You're God and I'm not.", "Noah here, reporting for duty!" or "I didn't see that coming! You're the Boss Applesauce!"

Pause: After your words, what do you immediately hear needs to change in your life? Maybe you're convicted by how you haven't handed over a relationship, struggle, or worry to Him. Is He telling you that you need to work on submitting and surrendering in some specific place?

We Pray: "<u>Hallowed be Your name</u>," – because His name is what draws people into His family.

Personalize: How do I express the *honor* of sharing *His* family name? "How do I show You to others today", "Help me watch my mouth and give You glory", or "Give me courage to live like You."

Pause: to *listen* for all the opportunities and instructions that He provides each day where you could better display the *trust*, obedience, comfort, or joy that comes with an adoption into His family!

We Pray: "Your kingdom come." – cuz we want God to adopt everyone and transform everything! Personalize: How do I express my desire for His rule over this world? "I can't wait till everyone gets what You're giving", "What can I do to get things ready for You?", or "Whose heart needs help?" Pause: Do you have any ideas that might be His instructions for you to do, so He can get it done. Is your heart the holdup cuz you've got someone or something else already on His throne or is there a different heart that just needs your love. Either way, can you hear what He wants you to do?

We Pray: "Your will be done" – because we want to be the faithful servants that get-r-done!

Personalize: How do I best express my obedience to His will? "What's the plan Coach?", "Remind me to shut up Lord!", or "Soften my heart, cuz I know I whine when I don't get my way!"

Pause: And return to His Word to make sure you've heard what His will really is, and what you're really willing to do. Maybe kept what He wants from you, off limits; so check yourself.

We Pray: "On earth as it is in heaven." – because we know whatever He has works better.

Personalize: How can I be express my trust for what I can't see? "Show me where I went wrong at work?", "Grow my faith in the future", or "Help me to look past the distractions down here!"

Pause: Maybe things are good and He's giving you a glimpse of what He's got in store or maybe things are rough to remind you of what earth won't offer. Listen for any life lessons He's teaching!

We Pray: "Give us this day our daily bread." – because we want what God gives, no more, no less. Personalize: How do I best express my confidence in God's care? "Help me see when to say when", "Lay it on me Lord!", or the popular "Let me win the lotto if You think I can handle it". Pause: Is He giving you the lucky numbers? Probably not. But He's definitely giving you something; so maybe it's time to adjust your appetite to the truth, guidance, or discipline He's dishin' up.

We Pray: "And forgive us our debts,"- because we've all violated our commitment to Christ.

Personalize: How do I best express my remorse for failing to do the right thing? "I'm sorry for what I said to Sally", "I blew it Lord, help me fix it", or "I'm a Bozo for being such a Jumbo Dumbo"

Pause: Often after you confess, you can immediately hear how to make a mistake right. Maybe God's saying to sit this one out while He works or maybe He wants you to rebuild what you broke.

We Pray: "<u>As we forgive our debtors.</u>" – because we want to pass on the grace we're given.

Personalize: How do I best express my gratitude to God through forgiveness? "Help me let go of my anger at Andrew", "Remind to give as good as I get", or "Hold me back, Lord!"

Pause: You know how hard it is to let someone who hurt you off the hook, so in all your angry arguments listen in case God is saying "You do that too!" And then thank Him by forgiving them.

We Pray: "And do not lead us into temptation" – because we want God to lead us away from it. Personalize: How do I best express my weakness and need for His help? "Help me keep cool when conversation gets political", "Give me strength to turn down dessert", or "Jesus, take the wheel!" Pause: to hear if God's given you the way away from what's tempting you. Maybe it's an example in His Word that inspires your strength or maybe it's a victory He gave to remind you He's there.

We Pray: "But deliver us from the evil one." – because we can't conquer anything alone.

Personalize: How do I best express my inadequacy? "Help, I can't escape the shame of what I did!", "Why is it that I can't quite quit smoking", or "Show me a way out of this depression."

Pause: to hear His escape plan. Maybe you need to let go of something that's dragging you down or maybe He's telling you to hold tighter to something that He'll use to lift you up.

We Pray: "For Yours is the kingdom" – because Jesus paid for it!

Personalize: How do I best express my *devotion* to my King! "I gladly give my offering today cuz everything I have is Yours.", "Lead me where you want me", or "Thanks for letting me live here!" Pause: Once you *confirm* He's your *King*, do you hear *Him* asking you to *behave* more like you *believe* and *belong?* Maybe you need to be *rejuvenated* by *re-reading* your King's inspiring *story*!

We Pray: "And the power and the glory forever." - because all things awesome are from Him.

Personalize: How do I best express my praise for an all-powerful God who saved me?! "I can't believe you made that sunset for me!", "Everything is nothing without You", or "I worship You"

Pause: Are any of His incredible exhibitions of power speaking to you? Maybe the serenity of your camping trip showed His gentleness or maybe a thunderstorm made you remember His strength.

We Pray: "Amen." – because we mean what we say.

**Personalize:** How do I best express my *certainty* for my *belief* in Him? Well *this* little word is *already* packed with meaning. It's the Hebrew word for "Truly.", "Right on.", or "So be it.". And it's like the "I do" at a *wedding*; it's a vow to act on the truth you've just acknowledged. So to make it your *own* just choose the right *tone!* Was *today's* prayer a *tough* one? Maybe it gets an *exhausted*, "amen.", was it a *challenging* prayer? Well you can let Him know you're *on board* but *nervous* with an, "aMEN...". Or maybe you're just on *fire* after prayer and you want the *world* to know by *sealing* the *deal* with an, "AAAAMEN!". And though that ends the talking part of prayer, *we keep listening!* 

**Pause:** Because *however* you wrap it up, *remember* you've just *promised* to *carry out* what you've prayed – so keep your eyes and ears open all day, for every *whisper*, *hint*, or *nudge* Dad throws your way. And then get in *His Word* cuz that where we *confirm* every answer we've ever heard!



And the more you pray this way, the more you'll know what He has to say about *you*, *Him*, *your* relationship, and *His* plan. Because He promises:



Call to Me and I will answer you and tell you great and unsearchable things you do not know. - Jeremiah 33:3 NIV



And although prayer begins with us, it should always end in an illuminating adventure through His Word because:

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. - 2 Timothy 3:16-17 NIV

So practice getting real and then get ready to get going, cuz it's game on!

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
