The Real Deal

Trading Trust for Truth
October 15, 2023

Today we're learning to listen for trustworthy truth! Cuz whatever truth we trust becomes the belief behind the life we live – for better or worse! And after last week's look at the deadly consequences of a conflict between our truth and the truth, I think it would be a good exercise to question our confidence; so **Why do you trust your truth?** Well first, we have to answer the question behind that question. And it's the same one posed by Pilate after Jesus frustrates him with unwanted answers to all his questions:



What is truth? [Now that's a vital question!] – John 18:38 NIV



Because regardless of each person's answer, the truth we live by is the same truth we'll die for. And even though truth has always been a matter of life and death, it's more critical to question it than ever because it's never had so many different meanings. But still, in its most broad and basic sense, most generally believe, truth is the quality of reality. It's the ultimate explanation of why everything is the way it is. And every answer that accurately adds to and agrees with that explanation is under truth's umbrella and part of it.



For example, if I walk to my car after church and arrive to find a brandnew dent in my driver-side door, it's safe to say, something happened!
Now, there are limitless explanations for what might be true; another
door might've dinged it, a bouncing ball might've bumped it, or an
invisible unicorn might've kicked it. But, "mights" don't make things
right! In reality, there's only one story that explains what actually went
down. That's the truth. It's the authentic story behind reality. And like
the dent in my door, you and I are part of it. And we all want to know
the actual story behind us. Problem is, we weren't there! So, to find the
truth, we need a witness! And it must be one we trust! Because all truth
worth believing starts with a witness worth trusting. So, when it's
something beyond you, who's your go-to truth guru? Who do you trust
as an authority on the truth? Well, since you're sitting in a church, let's
assume you said Jesus! Well good choice, cuz He assures us:





The reason I was born and came into the world is to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to Me. [And that's when Pilate asked] What is truth?" – John 18:38 NIV

And if only he had a copy of John's Gospel, he could've flipped four chapters back for an answer:

[Cuz Jesus laid it out plainly, saying:] "I am the Way and the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through Me. - John 14:6 NIV

And with that answer, Jesus confirms: the truth we can trust isn't a "what"; it's a "who". Because when the truth we need goes beyond what we can see, we have to rely on someone else's sight.

And so, the biggest battles in our world are always over who gets that trust. Because our authorities on truth have authority over our lives. And it's a simple equation that usually puts them into that position: the power we perceive determines the authority we allow. It's why we pull over for police, pay taxes to the government, and buy whatever celebrities say!

So to know why we trust the truth we do; we really need to ask ourselves: whose power is behind our belief? And as much as we want to say it's God Himself: How do we know we're trusting the real deal? Could it be an imposter, imitating? Well, we've always got Paul's plan to find phonies:

Test all things; [and] hold fast what is good. - 1 Thessalonians 5:21 NKJ



Well okay, let's see if we can do it. I got three clips of different authorities; and I want you to spot the fake. [CLIPS] So, what do you think? Which one is the fake?



The point is this: **us humans aren't great at testing truth!** Because of our *limited* abilities, it's *difficult* to detect the *frauds*, *forgeries*, and *phonies*. And so, this world is *full* of opportunistic people willing to *lie* and *cheat* to earn our *trust* to take more *power*.



[No wonder] false messiahs and false prophets will appear and perform great signs and wonders to deceive, if possible, even the elect.

– Matthew 24:24-25 NIV



And since we only see part of the picture [1 COR 13:9], sorry to say, but deception's not just possible, it's trending! Look how easy it was for me to deceive! And if signs and wonders can be faked or falsified, we must learn to better discern trustworthy truth. The Good news is: God's got the perfect training plan – the bad news is – it's equal parts loving and painful. Here's an OT hint on how God handles misplaced trust:

[Back then, He said] My people would not listen to Me; Israel would not submit to Me. So I gave them over to their stubborn hearts to follow their own devices. - Psalm 81:11-12 NIV

Wait, is God saying He just *gives up* on us?! You wish! This is just the tack He takes when we won't trust His truth. Cuz as much as it pains *Him* to pain us, **He'll let us live out our lies to prove** they shouldn't be trusted! It's like a child believing it's a good idea to eat ice cream for breakfast, lunch, and dinner; if they won't trust Dad, there's always one way to prove the point – let them do it. And eventually, the tummy-ache of truth will teach them who to trust!

Well, we're all His dumb kids who want our ice cream! We want the truth and we want it on our terms! With sprinkles! We want Him to prove Himself before we give Him our trust! Like when:

The Jews then responded to [Jesus], [asking] "What sign can You show us to prove Your authority to do all this?" [And] Jesus answered them [and the 'me-first' mentality], "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days." They replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and You are going to raise it in three days?" - John 2:18-20 NIV

And by letting them believe that's what He meant, He 'gave them over to their stubborn hearts to follow their own devices'. Cuz they trusted in their limited understanding more than His authority,











But the temple He had spoken of was His body. - John 2:21 NIV

And now, in addition to missing the miracle that would've proved the truth they wanted – their stubborn hearts won't just ache from living a lie; they'll spread the pain by actually killing the truth! Cuz later on:

The chief priests and the whole Sanhedrin were looking for false evidence against Jesus so that they could put Him to death. But they did not find any, though many false witnesses came forward. Finally two came forward and declared, "This fellow said, 'I am able to destroy the temple of God and rebuild it in three days." - Matthew 26:59-61 NIV

And it was those *misheard* words that started Jesus toward the cross. Real truth really is a matter of life and death! And by continuing to let us believe the deceit of our own stubborn hearts, Jesus is proving that He'd rather die than let us have *His* truth on *our* terms. Y'know *why?!* Cuz the last time someone went after that knowledge without trusting God's authority, it was Adam and Eve – and the fruit of that mistake caused more than just a tummy-ache, it separated us from God! And God loves us too much to let us repeat that mistake!

So what do we do? Well, we've got to change our wicked ways by letting Jesus flip the script.

Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to Him, and [then] He will make your paths straight. – Proverbs 3:5-6 NIV

Get it? Back in the Garden, we acted as the ultimate authority when we took His truth before giving Him our trust – so now, it's up to us to prove it's His power we're putting as our authority! And we do that by just giving God our trust before we have His truth; aka having Faith. Like His disciples.

Cuz these kids heard the same strange claim about destroying and restoring the temple – but, instead of assuming they understood the truth behind His words, they trusted Jesus and waited until something apart from their own heart made it make sense. And one day,

After [Jesus] was raised from the dead, His disciples recalled what He had said. [and] Then they believed the Scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken. - John 2:22 NIV

Y'see, up until that point, all they knew for sure was that didn't know. And until Jesus Himself proved He was the One behind any belief, they knew all they could do was trust. And you know how the disciples were able to trust when others failed? Let's ask 'em! How'd you guys do it John?

We know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. – 1 John 4:16 NIV

Booyah! There's the secret sauce to the whole enchilada! If we want a truth we can trust with a stubborn and self-centered human heart full of deceit, it's gotta be as un-fakable as it is unbreakable! And try as we might, nobody can counterfeit true love. Know why?

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. [And *most importantly*] Love never fails. But where there are *prophecies*, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. — 1 Corinthians 13:4-8 NIV

Almost everything on earth *can* be faked with a forgery; from *friends* and *flowers* to *fidelity* and *faith*. But **all phonies eventually fail**. And *due* to all the *different dimensions* that have to be *flawlessly fulfilled* on an *ongoing basis*, **true love is too perfect to make pretend**. Especially the way it *won't* pass away, but actually *grows* in death:

There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends. - John 15:13 NLT







The real power behind the real deal isn't a show of force it's an act of love! So that's what we should look for when we want to authenticate His identity. Remember how easy it was to call Morgan Freeman a fraud? That's because appearances are easy to fake; but character isn't. And comparing who we knew to what he said made it easy call shenanigans on the false Freeman. Well likewise, God's faithful know true love is His character's tell-tale trait that can't be faked. And the more familiar we become with Who He is and how He loves, the more skilled we'll be at detecting His truth. Because God's supernatural love leaves His fingerprints all over reality.

So if we want to trust that the God of the universe is behind something we believe, we gotta look for the love. Cuz *love* is all God ever writes – and *He's* the Author of the *entire* universe!

And if you can't connect any explanation to some expression of God's love, call it into question! And don't accept any answer until you see that love! Especially when your impatience is keeping you from being impartial. Remember, God can't prove Himself on your terms, cuz making you the boss throws everything off and keeps us all out of His kingdom. And when we see it's still His love that makes us wait, we should at least love the Lord enough to finally hear Him out on His terms.

That is what the Scriptures mean when they say, "No eye has seen, no ear has heard, and no mind has imagined what God has prepared <u>for those who love Him.</u>" - 1 Corinthians 2:9 NLT

And if we ever *feel* the sting of our *stubborn heart* listening to one of this world's *lying leaders*, remember, we can flip the script at *any* time, give God our trust, and let Him lead our life; knowing truth *is* on the way, *on* His terms, as part of our *Dad's* loving plan. And that way, we're *guaranteed* to get the ice cream *God* wants to give, without any more *lessons* from the *tummy-aches* of truth!

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
