Getting Giving

Inspiring Imitations of God's Love

Today we're exploring why gift giving is so important to everything God's getting done! Cuz there's not one part of His plan that doesn't involve a spirit of giving and there's not one time of the year where we're closer to that spirit than Christmas! So, since we're in the season, let's take a look at how we're living as we ponder: What's so great about giving?











Well, ask any kid this question and they'll give the obvious answer; giving is great cuz someone gets stuff! And it's usually them! When I was a kid, I liked getting anything! The quality or cost didn't matter; some of the cheapest gifts were my favorite, some of the most expensive weren't. And I mean, what kid doesn't have swordfights with wrapping-paper tubes before spending any time with their actual presents!

But the point is this: **value is in the heart of the receiver!** What a present is *worth* is a *subjective* assessment made *only* by the one *getting* the gift. Unless of course, *someone* leaves the tag on... *like my wife*. She chronically *forgets* to take them off and then spends hours *securing* them in a gorgeous, ribbon-wrapped, *Fort Knox* that makes it a *crime* to reopen and *check* for tags. So, *I'm* always on duty Christmas morning to *spot* forgotten tags, *grab* the gift, and *peel* the price off like a ninja!

And why am I so worried about it? Cuz price tags affect how we feel about what we receive. They reveal the value someone else has assessed before the receiver's heart gets to decide what it's worth to them. And that stinks, cuz all givers want real responses from receivers because sincere feelings have to start in our own heart.

For where *your* treasure is, there *your* heart will be also. [Notice it's not 'where someone else's' treasure is.] – Matthew 6:21 NIV


So, as children, our heart continues treasuring the gifts we're given year after year until slowly, the strangest thing happens; our attention turns to the giver! The more we receive, the more we witness what giving looks like; and it looks fun! I remember recognizing the incredible power my parents wielded on Christmas; they could create authentic emotions of shock, awe, disbelief, and delight! They were like "joy dealers" and everyone was addicted to what they offered!

And because of that *appeal*, we all want in! It usually starts with an ornament made at school but quickly escalates until suddenly, you're fourteen and pitching in with siblings to change dad's life with a brand-new lawn mower! And with each experience, we start to treasure giving a little more and getting a little less. Then one day, we see, our getter heart was subtly swapped for a giver's.

[Because] As water reflects the face, so one's life reflects the heart. – Proverbs 27:19 NIV

And after becoming a *parent*, giving *my* kids gifts, and watching *them* grow up, I'm happy to see that *same* heart reflected by *their* lives as they start moving from *getter* to *giver*. Because it's not just good behavior – going from getter to giver saves our life!








The heart is *deceitful* above all things and <u>beyond cure</u>. [Wait – did he just say 'beyond' cure?!] – Jeremiah 17:9 NIV



Yeah – cuz human hearts can't comprehend how giving leads to living, not loss. We're stuck on material math; me minus something equals less me! And me no like that! And it would take a supernatural heart transplant from an out-of-this-world source to shift our perspective.



[So, good thing God promises] I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; — Ezekiel 36:26 NIV





If anyone is *in* Christ, the new creation has come [along with its new heart!]: The old has gone, the new is here! – 2 Corinthians 5:17 NIV

And Jesus' heart makes it *clear* where we stand on *giving*, cuz He said:

'It is more blessed to give than to receive.' – Acts 20:35 NIV

But here's the problem – our flesh is still fighting to reject His heart transplant. So it takes a lot of effort to sustain it as we adapt to its new desires. We have to learn why we believe what it believes; why giving is better than receiving. But teaching anyone anything is an uphill battle! Cuz

The student is not above the teacher, – Luke 6:40 NIV


And assuming the inferior role of student has always been an unwelcome attack on our ego! In fact, believing we know best is such a prideful problem – it's what got us kicked out of paradise!

So what's God to do with us *stubborn* students? How can *He* get *us* to learn the lesson we need to live when we *don't* want *any* input at all? Well, **He tricks us**. Like a holy Tom Sawyer!

Remember how *Tom* tricked his buddy Ben into painting Aunt Polly's fence for him? He *convinced* Ben that there was no greater *pleasure* or *privilege* than painting *this* fence; and maybe, if Ben *traded* him his apple, Tom might *let* him paint a little. And by the end of the day, *every* boy who passed by wound up *giving* something to Tom for the *honor* of doing *his* chore *for* him! Because, *Tom* knew what *God* knows, **making something desirable inspires our action!**

Well, the same way Tom hid *doing chores* behind our desire for *pleasure*, **God hides** *learning* **lessons behind our desire for power**! When I was a kid on *Christmas*, the most *attractive* part of *giving* was the *power* my parents wielded as the *gatekeepers* of joy; but in *pursuing* that power, my *selfish* heart was *tricked* into saving up my hard-earned money – to practice *selflessly giving it all away!* Aint it just *poetic* how **God exploits our** *selfish* heart to accomplish *selfless* deeds!







And it's the *special* love that we only learn from a position of *power*. The kind that's not *forced* or *coerced* and *doesn't* come from a place of *obligation*. The kind that only comes from the *heart*. So **God wants** us giving cuz *that's* when *His* heart starts beating in *our* chest. And we can see His *desire* for this development in Scripture, like when He says:



<u>I desire mercy, not sacrifice,</u> and *acknowledgment* of God rather than burnt offerings. – Hosea 6:6 NIV



He wants actions of the heart, not offerings of obligation. Cuz let's be clear, God doesn't need anything from us. So if He ever asks for something, giving it is for our benefit, not His! And giving sacrifices from a position of obligation is good practice to prepare a child's heart, but mercy means we've begun living with our new heart.

It means we're giving because we want to, not cuz we have to. And that's priority #1 for Jesus!

[Like He said,] If you are offering your gift at the altar and *there* remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there in front of the altar. *First* go and be reconciled to *them*; *then* come and offer your gift. – Matthew 5:23-24 NIV

Because Jesus knows, the more we give things like mercy freely from the heart, the more we'll learn about real love; and the more we know about real love, the more we'll share in His heart. Which is why when the rich young ruler says he's followed all the obligations of the law,

Jesus answered, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell your possessions and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. <u>Then come</u>, follow Me." – Matthew 19:21 NIV

Cuz there's an order of operations; getting gifts leads us to giving gifts and then giving gifts leads us to getting God's heart. And as we understand and appreciate the value of His heart, we are again inspired to imitate as our attention turns to the ultimate Giver. And just like kids at Christmas, we want to try giving like He does. Which we're encouraged to do:

<u>Follow God's example</u>, therefore, as dearly *loved children* and [in turn,] *walk* in the way of *love*, just as Christ loved us and gave <u>Himself up for us</u> – Ephesians 5:1-2 NIV

But right there, things change. Cuz we just saw the tag left on God's Gift. He gave Himself. Giving us His heart and His love cost Him His life. He packed all of His infinite presence and power into a single vulnerable human body just so we would see that the relationship He wanted with us — was worth more than everything in existence. Because He wanted His gift to teach us that value is in the heart of the receiver because only love gives things value. And He gave up all other material value to prove it — which meant He couldn't come as a blazing fire the way He did with Moses, nor could He come as the mighty whirlwind Job saw or the earth-quaking thunder that shook David...



Rather, He made Himself *nothing* by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to death [So that mere humans could say] – Philippians 2:7-8 NIV



To us a child is born, to us a son is given, - Isaiah 9:6 NIV



Because everything He was, was now in *our* hands and under *our* control. And when we *see* the God of the universe is willing to lose *all* of His *material value* just to come here and save *us*, **we all get a glimpse of love's ultimate power.** Making it *our* ultimate *desire!* Cuz



<u>This is how we know what love is:</u> <u>Jesus Christ laid down His life for us.</u> And <u>[seeing love's life-saving power even after loss of life]</u> we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters.—1 John 3:16 NIV

For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life. [And if you've received His Son, you should] – John 3:16 NIV

Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. – Luke 6:36 NIV

[Cuz that's part of receiving God's heart! And] Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, – Romans 12:1 NIV

[Because] The student is *not* above the teacher, *but* everyone who is fully trained will be like their teacher. – Luke 6:40 NIV

Cuz as we give, God gets us to not only learn about His heart, but slowly swap it out for His! So, take the bait! Surrender yourself like He did and see what happens! Because if God can entice us to try wielding the ultimate power of ultimate giving, we're guaranteed to learn the lesson that saves our life: Love conquers all. Even the grave.

[Because] God is love. – 1 John 4:8 NIV

And by giving *Himself* to us, **the infinite** *value* **of** *His* **infinite** *love* **gave us infinite** *life*. So now the question *is*, **do you want to be** *like* **your Teacher?** Cuz when God gave you His heart through His Son, you were *also* given the power to give *life* to *others*. All it takes is giving 'em a gift so good, it turns their attention to the ultimate Giver! And if there's one thing to learn from Christmas, it's that there's no better gift to give, than *yourself!*
