
Importunity

The Command for Shameless Audacity


Today we're learning how to demand what we don't deserve! Cuz sometimes, it's a fine line between confidence and arrogance and the question that keeps us on the right side of God's will is this: Are your demands based on God's commands?


















[Well, it's common among Christians that] When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures. – James 4:3 NIV



And His command was to *love each* other; not just *ourselves*. So, **every** demand we make must be motivated by a love of others.

[And by following that command] This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of Him. – 1 John 5:14-15 NIV

And that's why Jesus taught us to include "Thy will be done" Matt 6:10 in all our prayers; it's a way to keep our requests *righteous* and *overrule* our naturally *selfish* demands. And *yet,* in the *same* teaching *we're* also *commanded* to *demand* God "Give us each day our daily bread." Luke 11:3. Why?

Well, just one verse later, Jesus seems to anticipate the question and offers this parable:









"[Suppose you go to a friend] at midnight and say, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of *bread*; a friend of *mine* ... has come to me, and I have no food to offer *him*.' [out of *love*] And suppose the one inside answers, 'Don't bother me. The door is already locked, and my children and I are in bed. I can't get up and give you anything.' I tell you, even though he will not get up and give you the bread because of *friendship*, yet because of your *shameless audacity* he will surely get up and give you as much as you need. "So [when it comes to making demands of *Me*, says Jesus,] I say to *you*: *Ask* and it *will* be given to you; *seek* and you will find; *knock* and the door will be opened to you. – Luke 11:5-10 NIV

So... we're supposed to ask God for things with shameless audacity?! Yeah! Technically the Greek word is anaídeia [ah-NAY-thee-ah], and it's also translated as impudence, persistence, pestering, and most literally, importunity. Ever heard that word? It's a bit old-timey, but it means being annoyingly persistent with troublesome urgency when making demands. So, I think the NIV actually nails it with "shameless audacity". Think about the way Ralphie went after that Red Ryder in A Christmas Story! It's that persistence but for someone else's present!

But *still*, why would being *annoying* beat being *friends?* Well, *importunity* is a sign of sincerity! The *more* something *means* to us, the more we'll *harp* on it. Cuz when we want something *more* than anything, we won't take "no" for an answer! It's our *persistent importunity* that *proves* our *heart's priorities*. So, Jesus gave us this parable about the *character* of our *prayer* to remind us of *two* things: Our demands need to be *selfless* and our demands need to be *sincere*.

So, it makes perfect sense His command to pray includes instructions to make the *daily demand* "Give us the bread Lord!" as long as our intention is to share it with friends! Because loving others is God's will but shameless audacity is His way. And it's why these two words get their own verse:

Pray continually - 1 Thessalonians 5:17 NIV



Cuz practice makes *perfect* and the more we *perfect* our *prayer* the more it pushes us to *practice sincere selflessness*. Cuz like *all* of God's commands, His *prayer* instructions grow *the* unique trait that *all* kids of the King share: humble confidence. Cuz humble submission to God's command, comes with the confidence of *His* strength on *our* side.

[And that's the picture of faith! So,] Let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings, ... Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for we should be confident cuz] He who promised is faithful. – Hebrews 10:22-23 NIV

[In fact, the redemption we were promised came with Jesus; so now] In Him and through faith in Him we may approach God with freedom and confidence. – Ephesians 3:12 NIV

And to illustrate what the delicate dance of humble confidence looks like, listen to this story:

[Once upon a time, Jesus was holed up in a house and] A woman of Canaan came from that region and cried out to Him, saying, "Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David! [Note the humble submission to Jesus as Master and Messiah] My daughter is severely demonpossessed." But He answered her not a word. [Sounds like a loving demand, but how can we know if her selflessness is sincere?] And His disciples came and urged Him, saying, "Send her away, for she cries out after us." But He answered and said, "I was not sent except to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." Then she came and worshiped Him, saying, "Lord, help me!" But He [giving more opportunity for importunity] answered and said, "It is not good to take the children's bread and throw it to the little dogs [like you]." And she said, "Yes, Lord, yet even the little dogs [like me] eat the crumbs which fall from their masters' table." Then Jesus answered and said to her, "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be to you as you desire." And her daughter was healed from that very hour. — Matthew 15:22-28 NKJ



Now that's the shameless audacity of faith! And that's the model for humble confidence that every Christian should stand up and salute! This woman confidently walks right up to Jesus and demands His help for someone she loves and when He says she doesn't deserve it, she humbly agrees – but doubles down on her demand!



"I know I don't deserve a seat at the table – but You commanded me to come! I know I was born a dog, but I hear making You my Master, makes me born again – as a kid of the King. And if that's true, I'm just following orders to demand what You command! Even if it's nuts!"



You hear it?! That's the Gospel in all its glory kids! And it does sound nuts! None of us deserve to be at God's table – but we're commanded to demand a seat as honored guests! Cuz after Jesus paid for the sin that separated us from God, He expects us to confidently come home!

We just need to stop confusing *confidence* with *arrogance* and *humility* with *timidity*. Cuz **timidity** means we don't *believe* what Jesus *did* accomplished what He *said*. Cuz He said it made us worthy.

For the *Spirit* God gave *us* [through His Son's sacrifice] does *not* make us timid, but gives us *power*, *love* and *self-discipline*. – 2 Timothy 1:7 NIV

For those who are *led* by the Spirit of God are the children of God. – Romans 8:14 NIV

And His children always have a seat at His table! Cuz His children are all there to share God's love:

[So,] Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth. This [love] is how we know that we belong to the truth and how we [have the confidence to] set our hearts at rest in [God's] presence. [Now,] If our hearts condemn us [as unworthy], we know that God is greater than our hearts, [and He says we are worthy] and He knows everything. [And] Dear friends, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence before God and receive from Him anything we ask, because we keep His commands and do what pleases Him. And this is His command: to believe in the name of His Son, Jesus Christ, and [by His power,] to love one another as He commanded us. – 1 John 3:18-23 NIV

So, is that how you're living? Do you daily feel *God's* strength as you submit to God's will? If not, don't worry, it takes considerable practice! Christian life turns worldly life upside-down; and we have to re-learn humility without timidity and confidence without arrogance. Because, down here, strength usually means superiority and submission means inferiority — but both feelings can ruin a relationship. Cuz true love can't be one sided! Both parties have to believe life's better with their partner! We have to know we want them and they want us! And only when we have that confident relationship with Jesus can we humbly demand His help with the love He commands:

Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from His love... then make my joy complete [says Paul] by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others. In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to His own advantage; rather, He made Himself nothing ... Therefore God exalted Him to the highest place ... [So,] my dear friends, ... continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, [as humble children whose confidence only comes through the commands of their King] for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill His good purpose. – Philippians 2:1-13 NIV









Y'know, I had a friend who used to work for the Bill and Melinda Gates foundation – and she had the *coolest* job I ever heard; *spending their money!* She just went out to meet with organizations who needed funding to fight *disease*, *poverty*, and *injustice* around the world. And when she found *opportunities* where the *foundation's* money could *save* lives, *she* had to *convince* the Gates' *estate* to write a big fat check! Cuz even though they were *loaded*, the Gates' *weren't* interested in *wasting* a penny. So, when making their *decision*, I'm sure there was nothing like an employee's *annoyingly persistent pleas* to put the foundation's mind *at ease!* Cuz they could *see* the *sincere belief* that *this* gift would *serve* the *foundation's purpose*.

And as cool as that *is*, here's what *we* need to see when we walk out these doors *today*: We have that same incredible job! We've been hired to give away God's riches! His infinitely valuable life-saving love is freely given by His grace – and all anybody needs is someone to connect them to His foundation! And that's our commission! We're supposed to humbly acknowledge that we don't have the power to save a single soul on our own, but confidently ask God to save 'em all!

[Just like Paul said,] Although I am less than the least of all the Lord's people, this grace was given me: [the command and confidence] to preach to the Gentiles the boundless riches of Christ, – Ephesians 3:8 NIV

Cuz when *our* ultimate authority *commands* us to *love each other*, we *can't* take "no" for an answer; even if it means demanding *His help* with *importunity!* Cuz *He knows* the *unique* humble confidence it takes to get *us kids* to *His table*; but *He's determined* to feed *us* the feast we don't deserve!

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
