Jasper Jesus Clear as a Crystal Cornerstone June 29, 2025



Today we're going to try to learn to be a lot more sympathetic to ... our Savior!



Do you ever feel sorry for God? We should.

I mean *think* about what He's had to put up with! Now, back in the day, the Corinthians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Thessalonians populated the pagan Roman cities that were centers of idolatry and indulgence. And yet, Paul says:

The Lord's message *rang out* from *you* ... [and] <u>your faith in God</u> [rather than *yourselves*] has become known *everywhere*. ... They tell *how* <u>you</u> *turned* <u>to</u> <u>God</u> from *idols* to *serve* <u>the</u> *living* and *true* <u>God</u>, and to *wait* for <u>*His* <u>Son</u> from *heaven* – 1 Thessalonians 1:8-10 NIV</u>

But the Jews in those same cities, rather than turning to the Lord, turned on His ambassadors.

What then shall we [ambassadors] say? [Says Paul. Simply] That the Gentiles, who <u>did not</u> <u>pursue righteousness</u>, have <u>obtained it</u>, [as in <u>received</u> it, as] a [gift of] righteousness that is by faith; but Israel, who <u>pursued a law of righteousness</u>, has <u>not attained it</u>. [As in <u>earned</u> it] Why not? Because they <u>pursued</u> it <u>not by faith</u> but as <u>if</u> it were [attainable] <u>by works</u>. [And so] They <u>stumbled</u> over the "stumbling stone." As it is written: [in Isaiah 28:16 and 8:14] "See, I lay in Zion a <u>Stone that causes men to stumble</u> ["in judgment" (Is 28:7)] and a <u>Rock</u> that makes them fall, ["prostrate at the soles of Your feet" (Is 60:14)] and the one who <u>trusts</u> in <u>Him</u> [for righteousness, "Coming to Him as to a living Stone" (1 Pet 2:4); and the "Rock of my salvation" (2 Sam 22:47)] will never be put to shame." – Romans 9:30-33 NIV



Cuz righteousness *must* be "obtained", cuz it *can't* be "attained", cuz it's gotta be *perfect*, cuz *otherwise*, **we** *can't* **come** *into* **His** *presence*. For *that*, we *need* a *Rock* and a *Hand*. Did you know "*presence*" and "*face*" are the *same word in Hebrew*? Remember *when* God *passed* by *Moses*? His *face* was *off limits*.

The Lord said, "I will cause *all* My *goodness* [some Bibles say: My *beauty*] to *pass* in front of you, *and* I will *proclaim* My *name* ... But," He said, "you cannot see My face, for *no one* may see Me and *live*." ... [So] When My *glory* passes *by*, I will *put* you in a cleft *in* the *rock* and *cover* you with *My hand until* I have passed *by*. *Then* I will *remove* My *hand* and you will see My *back*; but <u>My face</u> must *not* be *seen*." – Exodus 33:19-23 NIV

Why? Well, remember when they looked into the Ark of the Covenant, in Indiana Jones? And the priest says, "It's beautiful!" and their faces melt off? It's kind of like that. God says, "You'll need a face shield, or ... you'll kind of explode." Because, when man's impurity meets the full force of God's glory, the reaction is nuclear. Have you heard of superheated water? It's one of those "urban legends" that's actually true! Water boils by forming bubbles around impurities, called nucleation sites. Which means you can microwave purified water way past its boiling point.

But the *moment* you *add* an *impurity*, like *sugar*, it'll *explode violently*. Likewise, **the** *blazing intensity* of God's *holiness instantly obliterates impurity*. The way light *destroys darkness*. And you can't *attain perfect purity* with a *few good deeds* and *religious creeds*. Which is why:



The sinners [without a covering] in Zion [God's home] are afraid; [even John, Jesus' beloved disciple, falls at Jesus' feet, terrified, when He appears like the sun shining in all its brilliance! (Rev 1:16-17) So imagine how] fearfulness has seized the hypocrites: [saying] "Who among us can live with the continual fire? Who among us can live with everlasting burning?" [Do you find it fascinating that heaven and hell sound so similar? It must be more about being equipped to enjoy the experience! Like] He who walks righteously and speaks uprightly [down here] ... He shall dwell on high; [up there, because] his place of defense shall be the impregnable Rock – Isaiah 33:14-16 MEV

God didn't say to Moses: "I don't want you to see My face." He said, "You can't see My face ... and *live.*" Unless you're "in the Rock and [covered by] My Hand", both of which being "[His] name". You're likely familiar with Christ being called the Rock; but He's also quite often called ...

... the <u>Man of Your Right Hand</u>, [that is] the <u>Son of Man</u> whom You have made <u>strong</u> for Yourself! ... [So] Give us *life*, and <u>we will call upon Your name</u>! – Psalm 80:17-18 ESV

Know who's *name* this *sounds* like? Jacob's *youngest* and most *beloved* son, *Benjamin*. Whom *Jacob* literally *named* the *Son* of the *Right Hand*, which was *shorthand* for *power* and *strength*.

[So] Save [O God] with Your Right Hand, and answer us! – Psalm 60:5 NAS

[Because] Your Right Hand is lifted high in glorious strength. – Psalm 89:13 NLT

[Because] Your Right Hand is full of [the] righteousness [we need]. – Psalm 48:10 NKJ

Funny thing. In the *same* chapter, just *prior* to the *story* of Moses being *hidden* in the *Rock* and *covered* with *God's hand*, because *no one* can *see* the *Lord's face* and *live*, we're told that:

Inside the Tent of Meeting, the Lord would speak to Moses face to face, as a man speaks to his friend. – Exodus 33:11 NLT

So what do you suppose is going on here? It's actually fairly straight forward. In the same chapter, Moses is simply meeting with a seeable form or image of the Lord, that I like to call OT Jesus.

[The Lord said to Moses] I will send <u>My Angel</u> [lit. Messenger] before you" ... And He said, [this Messenger of] "<u>My Presence</u> [lit. My Face] will go with you" – Exodus 33:2, 14 NKJ

[And so] [The Lord] became their Savior ... [because] the <u>Angel of His Presence</u> [lit. Messenger of His Face] <u>saved them;</u> [and] in His love and in His pity He redeemed them; [and] He lifted them up and carried them all the days of old. – Isaiah 63:8-9 ESV

"And the Father Himself, <u>who sent Me</u>, [said Jesus] has <u>testified of Me</u>. [But, unlike <u>Moses</u>] You have neither <u>heard His voice</u> at any time, nor <u>seen His form</u>. ... For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me; for <u>he wrote about Me</u>." – John 5:37, 46 NKJ

[Saying] The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty Hand – Deuteronomy 26:8 NIV

Now I want to *remind* you [says Jesus' brother Jude] ... that <u>Jesus</u>, who <u>saved a people</u> <u>out of the land of Egypt</u>, afterward <u>destroyed those</u> who did not <u>believe</u>. – Jude 5 ESV

For it is the *God* who commanded *light* to *shine* ... in our *hearts* to give the *light* of the *knowledge* of the *glory* of *God* <u>in the *face* of Jesus Christ</u>. – 2 Corinthians 4:6 NKJ

He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of <u>the Son of His love</u>, in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins. <u>He is the *image* of the *invisible God* – Colossians 1:13-15 NKJ</u>

[And so] Even though we have known Christ <u>according to the flesh</u>, yet now we know Him thus [as a simple seeable image of His true self] no longer. – 2 Corinthians 5:16 NKJ

Until the *appearing* of our Lord Jesus Christ ... the King of kings and Lord of lords ... who *lives* in *unapproachable light*, whom *no one* has *seen* or *can see*. – 1 Timothy 6:13-16 NIV









Have you seen the award winning *documentary:* "The Boy Whose Skin Fell Off"? It opens with Jonny Kennedy's 36-year-old body being prepared for a funeral, and lying in a coffin, and his voiceover, recorded just weeks prior, says: "That's me in the box. I've come back in spirit. I'll tell you the story of my life, and my death." Talk about a tear-jerker! He had a condition that caused his skin to blister and peel at the slightest touch. So he lived a life of constant pain and open sores. And a sense of humor, and faith. But the heartbreaker under it all, is his loving mother who can't help but hurt him when helping him. There's an almost *unwatchable scene* where she *gently changes* his *bandages*. And his skin tears. And he swears. And immediately asks for forgiveness. And she describes what it's like to have a child you love with all your heart, but can't hold or hug without causing harm. And she is a picture of our unapproachable Savior's predicament. Think of Jesus weeping over Jerusalem, (Lk 19:41) or saying how often He longed to gather her children as a hen gathers her chicks under her wing. (Mt 23:37) But, without perfect purification from every *impurity, His kids can't even see His face* – let alone *feel His embrace*. So *feel* for Him, and relate to why He longs for us to obtain and grow in His righteousness. Which is quite literally the only miracle cure. The self-aware pagans saw a relational exchange, wherein we receive by giving. Whereas, the self-righteous purists saw a transactional negotiation, and therefore downplayed, to the point of disregarding, their need for the cure.

Which *brings* us *back* to the *"stone* that causes *men stumble"*. Because Paul *only quotes* a *few words* of Isaiah 28:16: *"I lay in Zion a stone"*, *leaving* it to *us* to *seek* and *find* the *rest* of the *warning* to those who *reject* God's *Right Hand Rock* of *refuge*, who *might* as *well* be *saying*:

"We have made lies our refuge and under falsehood we have hid ourselves." Therefore, thus says the Lord God: "See, <u>I lay in Zion a Stone</u>, [and it's] <u>a tested Stone</u>, ["For we do not have a High Priest who is unable to sympathize ... but One who has been tested in every way as we are, yet without sin." (Heb 4:15 HCS) and He's] <u>a precious cornerstone</u>" – Isaiah 28:15-16 MET And Isaiah knew all about High Priests and precious cornerstones, because God told Moses to:



"Make the <u>breastplate of **judgment**</u>. [As a covering for the High Priest] ... [with] four rows of [precious] stones: [the first cornerstone in] the first row shall be a <u>sardius</u> ... [and the last cornerstone in] the fourth row ... a <u>jasper</u>. ... And the [twelve precious] stones shall have the names of the sons of Israel" – Exodus 28:15-21 NKJ

Which is *why* the *first* precious cornerstone, a *sardius,* was named *Reuben,* Jacob's *firstborn;* and the *last* precious cornerstone, a *jasper,* was named *Benjamin,* Jacob's *lastborn.*

[But] This is the main point of the things we are saying: <u>We have such a High Priest</u>, who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in the heavens – Hebrews 8:1 NKJ

[And since He] Placed <u>His Right Hand</u> on [John] and said ... "I am <u>the First</u> [as in "the Firstborn over all creation" (Col 1:15); and "the Firstborn from the dead" (Rev 1:5)] and the Last." [As the "Benjamin" or "Son of the Right Hand" of God] – Revelation 1:17 NIV

It shouldn't *surprise* us when John *says,* in "the *revelation* of Jesus Christ", (Rev 1:1) that:

I was in the Spirit; and behold, a *throne* set in *heaven*, and One *sat* on the *throne*. And *He* who *sat* there was like <u>a *jasper* and a *sardius* stone</u> in *appearance* – Revelation 4:2-3 NKJ

[Because] You shall see ... and the Hand of the Lord shall be known – Isaiah 66:14 ESV

[Because] Your procession is *seen*, O God, the procession of my *God*, my *King*, into the sanctuary ... [And, what do you know:] There is <u>Benjamin</u>, [lit. the Son of the Right Hand] the <u>least of them</u>, in the <u>lead</u> – Psalm 68:24-27 ESV

[So] Behold, <u>the Lord's Hand</u> ... [because] His own arm brought salvation for Him; and His own righteousness, it sustained Him. For [instead of a breastplate of judgement] <u>He</u> put on righteousness as a [High Priest's] <u>breastplate</u> – Isaiah 59:1, 16-17 NKJ

Because **our** *Precious High Priest* **both** *brought* **and** *bore* **the** *judgment* **on our** *behalf!* Which is why, when John describes the *purified bride* of the *Lamb* having the *glory* of *God*, he says:

Her light was like a most precious ... jasper stone, [but] clear as crystal. – Revelation 21:11 NKJ



Because, *Jasper* is *one* of the *few* precious stones that *contains impurities*, which *prevent* any *light* from *passing through* it. But *we're* **made** *pure* **so** *we* **can** *see* **His** *face* **and** *feel* **His** *embrace*. And *that way* those *intense rays* can *wrap* right *around us*, cuz they'll *pass* right *through* us, without *causing us* any *harm*. Which *might* be *why* we're *told*, that:

Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His faithful ones. – Psalm 116:15 NRS

[Cuz] Your Hand shall lead me, and Your Right Hand shall [finally] hold me. – Psalm 139:10 NKJ

[*If*] [We] [as *His* priests] put on the *breastplate* of *faith* and *love* – 1 Thessalonians 5:8 NAS

Which is all righteousness basically boils down to. And I hope that clears things up for you.

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
