Today we're examining our everyday lives to catch the encouraging glimpses of God's good! Cuz earth may be our home away from home – but while we're here, God allows some hints of Heaven to break through – to raise our spirits with a sneak peek of our fulfilling future. So, the question is: Are you receiving what God's revealing?

Cuz with the distracting difficulties of daily life, we can walk right past them without even noticing they were there. In fact, they can get hidden in plain sight if we don't keep our eyes peeled for the opportunities. The same way I had walked past this door in Seattle many times back when I was a bartending musician who often gigged in the city on the weekends – until someone told me it was the sort-of-secret entrance to an incredible craft cocktail bar. And once inside, there was a magical menu of strange and inspiring flavors that just changed how I saw other "normal" pubs. And after that, I was invited to another one where you had to text a secret number before they'd open the door. But when you got in - same thing - an inspiring experience for those who were willing to seek the subtle entrances to something extraordinary! And before you get upset that I'm comparing speakeasies to spiritual opportunities you should know the guy who got me into these pubs is the same guy who got me to go to church... so just remember that the Lord works in mysterious ways!

And God may not *like* every choice we make down here – but make no mistake – **He can** speak through every choice we make down here!

And I'm telling you *this* story cuz the way *that* works in our *worldly life* – is the same way it works in our *spiritual walk*; *your* life is full of unassuming opportunities for an enticing *taste* of the Holy Spirit. We just have to have the *eyes* and *ears* to *anticipate* and *appreciate* what God's trying to *commuicate!* Which is why we're *encouraged* to:

Taste and see that the LORD is good; - Psalms 34:8 NIV

Remember a couple years ago when we talked about why people yell Olé at things like *bullfights?* You remember what it means? *God*. The word comes from *Allah*. Cuz down *here*, **when we see something so spectacular that it seems beyond this world, we suspect it was a sneak peek of something supernatural. Which it is, cuz in this world, errors and entropy are natural—and persistent perfection is how we describe Heaven alone. So, God gives us these exciting** *glimpses* **of the coming world to remind us that it's worth waiting for! Cuz each OLÉ moment is meant to just be an appetizer that keeps us hungry and happy until we're ready and willing for the full measure of God's full joy!**

But until then, living in **the** *Ole'* **spirit leads us to the Holy Spirit!** Cuz with every spectacular *sunset* we share with a *spouse*, every heartwarming *hug* we receive from a *friend*, and every awe-inspiring *meal* we taste with our *tongue* – **God is providing a momentary** *peephole* **into** *how good* **it** *could be* **if we were** *living* **in heavenly** *harmony*. And we're talking *everything* from that time you perfectly *parallel parked* to the *joke* you told at work that made everyone *laugh* until they *cried* – they're *all* secret *entrances* to a sneak a *peek* at how *good every moment* of our heavenly home *will be!*



Cuz Earthly pleasures were never meant to permanently satisfy, but only to suggest and awaken our higher desire for eternal fulfillment. And each glimpse of the godly ought to remind and encourage us that living our best life means accepting the best is yet to come. So, adjust your eyes:



Take delight in the *Lord*, [by looking for *Him* in every *earthly* joy] and He *will* give you the [*true*] desires of your heart [in the *end*]. – Psalms 37:4 NIV



So, truly ask is that what you're doing with your life? Are you approaching every moment as an opportunity to taste and see that the Lord is good? Or is your mind set on seeing all of the reasons to believe life is bad? It would be such a shame to walk right by something God specifically built to give you a boost when you need it most! So, to prevent that travesty, we're gonna practice this perspective by identifying potential peepholes.

Cuz Scripture provides quite a list of *promises* about our *future* that we can taste in the *present* – and when we keep *those* promises close to our *hearts*, the previews are easier to catch with our *eyes!*



And our first promise is a doozy: **you'll be reunited with Jesus.** And if you want to get *excited* about that *reality*, there's *plenty* of sneak peeks to give a small sense of that satisfaction. You ever had a family member take a job that takes them *away* for a season – like commercial *fishing*, construction *contracting*, or being *deployed* overseas? Then you know it's *hard* to handle their absense – and even as it *noramalizes*, you never stop *missing* them. Until that day they pull into the *driveway* and your heart just *jumps* out of your body as an emotional *reflex* to the reunion. Well, *that's* just a *tiny* taste of how it'll *feel* when *Jesus* fulfils *this* promise:

I will come back and take you to be with Me that you also may be where I am. – John 14:3 NIV

So, whether it's mom, dad, husband, or wife – every day that you're excited to see someone pull in your driveway, remember it's a fraction of a fraction of the feeling we'll feel once Jesus is in sight!

And second, you're promised a future where you'll defeat death. And if you want a sneak peek at that feeling, think about the last time you were so sick and tired you couldn't get out of bed — or worse, you couldn't stop hugging the toilet! But then remember the morning after the flu finally broke and you awoke and thought, "I can breathe; I can move; I'm alive again!" Well, we're told:

The dead will be raised imperishable – 1 Corinthians 15:52 NIV

Physical healing can feel like resurrection rehearsal cuz we're meant to eagerly anticipate the comfort and joy of eternal life with an immortal body! So, see relief from sickness as a peek at heavenly health.



Third, you'll be made new. Anybody binge those restoration shows, where a junkyard car becomes a showroom beauty or a fixer-upper is stripped to the studs and rebuilt into something glorious? I've got my own episode going; eighteen months into a bathroom remodel, but — I'm finally starting to see the deep satisfaction in a finished restoration! Well,

He who was seated on the throne said, "I am making everything new!" - Revelation 21:5 NIV

If *human* hands can renew what's falling apart, just imagine what God's hands can do with you! So let every before-and-after story raise your expectations for a flawlessly functional future.



Fourth, you'll stop suffering. You remember being a kid and having those days where everything just went *wrong* at school – and you were so sad until Mom met you at the door with a hug and a snack so you plop down for an episode of Saved by the Bell. Well that's a preview of how being in the presence of peace just cures crying; and *we're* promised:

'[God] will wipe every tear from [His people's] eyes. There will be no more death' or mourning or crying or pain – Revelation 21:4 NIV

And if imperfect parents can bring that kind of comfort for an afternoon, we should be *excited* to experience how the arms of our *perfect* Parent will *erase all anxiety* on the calm couch of *eternity*.



Fifth, you'll be reunited with loved ones. I think all of us have experienced how airport hugs feel different – and that's because absence makes the heart grow fonder – but it also makes reunion sweeter. And every departure we endure proves what both Joni Mitchell and the band Cinderella put it, "You don't know what you've got 'til it's gone."

[But we're told] [All believers] will be with the Lord forever – 1 Thessalonians 4:17 NIV

So, when earthly reunions make us weep with joy, we should see it as a reminder that eternity will be one *endless*, tear-wiping *embrace*. And when you feel the *weight* of missing someone now – don't let the ache lie to you; let it lead you – it's not the end of the story; it's just the *dark* we experience *before* every *dawn* – that trains our heart to trust *everything good is never gone!*



Sixth, you'll clear up your confusion. You know that moment when you're watching a movie and feel like you got lost — until some twist lis revealed and suddenly everything makes sense? Well, that kind of "click" happens all the time to remind you that all the random details of this life are eventually going to come together in your big moment of clarity:

For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; [but on the other side,] then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully – 1 Corinthians 13:12 NIV

If a human writers can flip confusion into clarity with one reveal, how much more will God connect every piece of your life when you see the full picture face to face? So, see every 'Aha' moment as the reassuring echo of the true Author's ability to give you the satisfying explanation you always wanted.



And seventh, you're promised **you'll see justice served.** There's a reason the true-crime craze has taken over TV – and a bit part is how much we love the feeling when new DNA finally exonerates the innocent and names the guilty; the same way we crave cops catching the car speeding past you and celebrate their siren slowing them down!

[So, don't worry] [God] will judge the world in righteousness – Psalm 9:8 NKJ

And every time you feel the fulfilment of truth prevailing, you should stop and savor how awesome it'll be to live full-time in a world where God exposes and ends all evil forever. Cuz roadside accountability and courtroom justice is just a taste of a world that is under the perfect rule of a perfect Ruler. And that should free us all to lower our defenses and vulnerably be our true selves.



And lastly, you're promised **you'll get more than you deserve.** You ever win a scratch ticket, get a refund you didn't expect, or open an incredible gift? Those moments are glimpses of the awesome feeling of unearned rewards – the way trust-fund kids can be born into billions that they get their whole lives to just try and spend. Well, good news:

[God] has given us... an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. [But don't expect more than a taste yet, cuz] This inheritance is kept in Heaven for you – 1 Peter 1:3–4 NIV

If you've tasted the goodness of an unearned gift and seen how earthly kids can inherit a fortune by birth – you should be able to project how excited you should feel about the reality of an *infinite*, *eternal* inheritance! So, celebrate every *birthday*, *Christmas*, and *raffle win* as a *puny preview* of how *electrifying* it will be when *our adoption* through Christ comes with *keys* to the *whole Kingdom!*



[Cuz] [We] who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, [aka the temporary tastes of future promises] groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship ... For in this hope we were saved. But ... if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently. In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness.— Romans 8:23-26 NIV

So are you letting the Spirit seize every opportunity to empower your patience? Are you seeing every small satisfying second as a door to explore and expand your perception of future potential? You should be! Cuz earthly joy is deliberately designed to make you hungry for Heaven! They're the firstfruit first course to awaken your appetite for the whole spiritual feast! So, don't let them slip by as a passing fancy! Dwell in them and delight in them!

Cuz even the smallest experiences present us with an opportunity for faith to flourish – if we're receptive to receive. But, every day we have to choose how we see things: are our experiences meaningless randomness or meaningful messages? And if you want to taste and see that the Lord is behind all the good – well, God says you gotta seek if you wanna find! So why not use this life to call that bluff? Why not look closer at every ordinary minute to see if it might hide a secret door. And if you catch a glimpse of something good – why not press your eye to the peephole, and treat that peek as the inspiring preview God created it to be. Cuz every "Holy moly" Ole' moment you experience is one more Holy Spirit sample meant to make you more excited for a future that's out of this world!
