## Thinking Thanking



Battling to Bring Blessings Into Focus

Today we're fighting for a future with God by growing a deeper gratitude toward God! Cuz every single day – God relentlessly gives every single human exactly what they need to spiritually satisfy every single desire. So, if we find ourselves feeling anxious or upset from some unfulfilled expectation, it's a sign our material mind is distracting us from seeing God's better blessings – which is the #1 way the enemy makes us lose our way when trying to follow God's lead. So, to keep us on guard and on track, the question that needs ongoing attention is: Where's your head at?

So, let's take a quick *poll;* raise your hand if you can *raise* your *hand? Great* – now how many of you *made it here* today? *Okay,* and how many have been able to *breathe* – *all morning? Wow!* So, *last* question – how many of you have *thanked* God *specifically* for *that strength, safety,* and *survival?* Me neither! *Why?!* Well, Proverbs offers honest *insight* on how human *minds* handle *whatever* we *have:* 

Give me neither poverty *nor riches*, but give me only my daily bread. Otherwise, <u>I may</u> have *too much* and disown You and say, 'Who is the LORD?' – Proverbs 30:8-9 NIV

But c'mon — does anybody ever think about how inhaling oxygen and exhaling carbon dioxide requires such physiological precision that every breath we take is a minor miracle? Again, I don't!



But the *principle* that *Proverbs* points out is – *abundance* breeds amnesia. Cuz we won't be *thankful for* what we don't *think about*. That is, we all tend to *tune out* what we don't have to *worry about* – making *essentials* like *oxygen*, easy to *overlook* when they're *ever-present*.



But that highlights a critical failure in our flesh's focus that has the power to sink our spirit: we're blessing-blind! Cuz we're blessing-abundant! After all, the very fact that we're all here – after throwing a wrench in God's gears back in the garden – means every second we exist is an gift of God's grace! And the same earthly eyes that pushed us to walk past all the perfect produce for the one forbidden fruit – are still behind our fleshly flaw that keeps us from seeing and seizing God's gifts: we get distracted by different but ignore normal. And that human part of our perception needs to take a backseat to our spiritual sight or we'll be no better than any other animal!



Like fish. Cuz fish are surrounded by water but don't even know they're wet for the same reason we're blessing-blind: when something essential is everywhere you don't notice it anywhere. However, if that's true, so is the inverse; when something essential is nowhere you notice it everywhere. So, if you want to teach a fish about water, let 'em leave it. Cuz the second a fish is out of water, they know all about it. They need it to breathe. They need it to move. They need it to live. And as they slowly

start drying and dying, all fish instantly know: they want the water back!





Well *likewise*, God *allows* us to wander *away* from the life-giving *gifts* of *His love* that *He* baked into every inch of *our* lives so when His *blessings* go *missing*, *we'd* suddenly see how much *we want Him:* 



God did this so that [people] would *seek* Him and *perhaps* reach out for Him and *find* Him, though *He is not far* from *any* one of us. 'For <u>in</u> Him *we live* and *move* and have *our being*.'— Acts 17:27-28 NIV



He's the living water and we're the foolish fish who are swimming in a sea of mind-blowing miracles that are so routine — we only notice them when they're missing. And although that should be convicting enough to go home and try being more grateful — what I really want you to hear today is this: it's more than a bummer; blessing-blindness means the enemy is winning your spiritual battle. And that's the biggest problem there is!




So we're gonna *unpack* it to build a bulletproof *battle plan* to *overcome* the enemy! And *that* starts with the Scriptural *strategy* Bruce outlined last week where *we* bring the battle *to our enemy* with a "Hi Cutie!" AKA:

Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good. - Romans 12:21 NIV

And he reminded us that the "good" we need as our ammunition — is found in God's Word cuz that's where we learn to recognize and receive all our blessings. But you know what that makes evil? The absence of that good. In the same way cold is just a lack of heat and darkness is a lack of light — evil only exists when God's good goes missing. But, because we're surrounded by His blessings, God's good only goes missing when we stop seeing! And we only stop seeing when something else steals our attention! So hear this loud and clear: To win the war for your heart, the enemy doesn't have to destroy you; he just has to distract you. Cuz emptiness is all evil needs to exist; so if the enemy can keep our attention on empty, earthly matters, our flesh's focus can starve our spirit!

[Cuz, unfortunately] The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak. – Mark 14:38 NIV







So, what do we do? Unfortunately, we can't just decide to focus on what should have our attention and ignore doing what shouldn't; otherwise we'd all be perfectly disciplined disciples immune to the enemy's empty distractions. But does that sound like anyone you know? Of course not! Cuz our flesh prefers easy paths – even if they're empty; and immediate fulfilment – even if it's fleeting. So the problem isn't just that we don't know what's right – it's that we don't want what's right enough.



Sure, our spirit does – but our weak-willed, easily-distracted flesh loves the path of least resistance.

That means it's not just a *willpower* problem. It's a wantpower problem. We *want* the *distractions* more than the *blessings* – and in the overly intellectual 19th c. sermon titled, *"The Expulsive Power of a New Affection"* Thomas Chalmers gives a great explanation of *why* willpower *doesn't* have enough *force* to make the *change:* We can't just *shut down* desire – *the heart's too powerful! He says*:



"It is quite in vain to think of stopping one of these pursuits in any way else, but by stimulating to another."



Simply put, willpower won't work cuz denial isn't enough – we need a stronger love to replace an existing pursuit; desire can't be suppressed without being supplanted. So, if we want to change our will, we have to change our want – which is why Scripture says:



Above all else, guard your heart, for *everything you do* flows from *it.* – Proverbs 4:23 NIV



And that's why the Christian walk isn't about trying to follow some legalistic rules that you know are right – it's about falling in love with the Lord you know you need! Cuz when Jesus becomes our deepest desire, we don't have to try to focus on His presence or fill our heart with His will, it just naturally happens the way every lovebird tells their partner, "I only have eyes for you!" Cuz true love doesn't feel like daily discipline or rigid restraint – it feels like the freedom to follow your heart! Case in point:



Jacob served *seven years* to get Rachel, but they seemed like only a *few days* to him *because of his love for her*. – Genesis 29:20 NIV

Seven years of work felt like a few days?! That's the effect of wantpower! So, how do we get our heart to want God's will above all else?

Well, that's the easy part, cuz your heart's a pushover! In fact, training it is one of the few benefits of our shallow flesh – cuz it develops a desire for whatever it stares at the most. Don't believe it? Then just see how far you make it today before you see some advertisement that paid millions of dollars just to spend a few seconds in front of your eyes. Our attention is the best marketing department that ever existed – cuz what gets thought the most – gets sought the most.

[So, no wonder the *Bible* stresses *constant contact* as a daily discipline] Keep *this Book of the Law <u>always</u>* on your lips; meditate on it <u>day and night</u>, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful. [And] – Joshua 1:8 NIV

Pray <u>continually</u> [to keep the conversation going; then, you'll] – 1 Thessalonians 5:17 NIV

Take delight in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart. - Psalm 37:4 NIV

Cuz delight isn't just a feeling; it's a focus. It's the result of giving something enough attention — that you start seeing all its deep, desirable value. And giving attention with intention of increasing desire is called gratitude. Which makes gratitude a powerful weapon in the war for our heart.

Cuz giving God gratitude isn't just shifting our focus, it's training our eyes to see the blessings that surround us — and that makes it an indestructible defense against the evil of emptiness. Cuz the more good we recognize and receive, the more we overcome the evil of anger, anxiety, and apathy — since it simply can't exist in the presence of Godly affection, assurance, and appreciation! Which means, gratitude toward God is ammunition against our enemy. It's only when we forget gratitude that our eyes drift to focus on the emptiness where evil grows.



And I remember a *comedian* talking about the idea saying, "We live in an *amazing* world – and it's *wasted* on *people*; cuz when our phones buffer for a second, we say, "Ugh! It's taking too long..." Give it a *second!* It's going to *space*. Will you give it *one* second to get back from *space?* Is the speed of *light* too *slow* for you? I was on an *airplane* with high-speed *internet* and when the thing *breaks down*, they *apologize*, "We're so sorry the internet's down." And the guy next to me says, "O, great! This stinks." And I wish I was *there* when he tells the "horror" story cuz I wanna say, "O, really? But, did you fly in the air – incredibly, like a bird? Did you partake in the miracle of human flight?" Everybody on every plane should be constantly screaming, "WOW!" Cuz you're flying. You're sitting in a *chair* in the *sky* – on a *five-hour* trip that used to take *years* where a bunch of people would just *die* along the way! Everything's *amazing*, yet somehow, *nobody's happy!*"

Listen, **gratitude is about way more than** *attitude;* there's a war for your heart and every moment we're not *thinking* about *thanking God*, we're taking something *amazing* for *granted* and leaving *empty* space for *evil* to grow! And *that's* why "thanksgiving" is repeated throughout God's Word as an *essential* routine. Thank *offerings* were part of the OT *sacrifices* (LEV 7:12); *giving* thanks is taught as a *core* part of *prayer* (COL 4:2); our *worship* is supposed to be an *act* of *thanks* (PSA 95:2); and our *witness* gets its *weight* from *our thankfulness* (PSA 9:1)! They're all ways for the *thoughts* in our *head* to *fill up* the *battlefield* in our *heart*. So *where's your head at?* Is it rooted in *gratitude* to focus on God's blessings – or is it distracted by *empty* earthly offerings – feeling more *stressed* than *blessed?* 

[Well, let's let *Scripture* lay out the solution *once* more:] Do not be anxious about anything, but <u>in every situation</u>, by prayer and petition, <u>with thanksgiving</u>, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will <u>guard your hearts and your minds</u> in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is *true*, whatever is *noble*, whatever is *right*, whatever is *pure*, whatever is *lovely*, whatever is *admirable*—if *anything is excellent or praiseworthy*—think about such things. — Philippians 4:6-8 NIV

Cuz thankful thinking is how we take the fight to the front lines! I mean, if the greatest country on earth began at a Thanksgiving table 400 years ago, just imagine what would happen if you built your little life with the same mindset! All the blessings you've been swimming in – would finally drown out every bit of evil that's been holding your heart hostage. So, this Thursday, I want everyone to go on the offensive – with a round of Blessing Bingo! Grab some cards on the way out and use this holiday weekend to start training your eyes to see what your spirit already knows: Jesus overcame this world on the cross so His blessings could overwhelm your life through your heart. And as you mark your card with all that Godly good, remember your gratitude isn't just loading in your love for God – it's loading up your weapon for the enemy; and once he's gone it's an eternity of smooth swimming!

Father God, thank You for loving me in spite of my sin; forgive me and cleanse me by the sacrifice of Your Son, my Savior; and free me and lead me by Your Spirit and Word, as I seek to trust and follow Jesus Christ, as the Lord of my life. Amen.
